2. Social Care precept

Bristol is responsible for providing social care services to our most vulnerable residents. We are permitted to levy an additional charge of up to 3% on top of the Council Tax increase to help pay for this. This option is currently only available for next year.

We are proposing to levy the maximum 3% social care precept in 2018/19. This is in addition to the general increase in Council Tax, and raises an extra £5.8m to help fund adult social care and protect vulnerable people. If applied with Option A above it will mean a total increase in the Council Tax of 4.99%)
