

## Beyond the Place of Safety Capital Potential Bid Idea

### (BNSSG Crisis Concordat bid)

<b>Title</b>	<b>Children and Young People's Safe Place</b>
<b>Brief description</b>	To develop a Safe Place stepped down facility in Bristol (with spot purchase facility across BNSSG) for children in care with mental health problems waiting in S136 suite, in emergency department or in out of area beds/ residential home/ school who would benefit from a local intensive support residential setting or foster care placement.
<b>Expected impact on the Crisis pathway in BNSSG including the 136 pathway specifically</b>	This would provide mitigation against the risk of exceeding the 24 hour time limit on a S136 when there is a need to identify a new placement for a child a care.
<b>How many people will benefit from this</b>	<b>Up to per annum</b>
<b>Anticipated cost</b>	Capital – refurbishment/adaptation costs  -Ideally approx £1m to enable a provision attached to mental health inpatient facility or  £400K for adapting a children's home.
<b>Links with other parts of the crisis pathway</b>	Children seen in Emergency Department following mental health needs waiting for a placement would benefit
<b>Does this help towards compliance with legislative requirements?</b>	Yes
<b>Does this demonstrate a commitment to partnership working ?</b>	Yes – this is a joint model where Bristol City Council run a BCC/ CCG jointly funded facility supported by our developing BNSSG CYP crisis / home treatment service
<b>Will the project reduce demand on the NHS or other public sector partners?</b>	Yes – currently children in care with mental health are using tier 4 inpatient and acute trust bed nights whilst awaiting placements.
<b>Is it sustainable i.e. are there already resources to deliver this as a service?</b>	Yes. Bristol City Council with a contribution from NHS BCCG will run the service ongoingly.
<b>Will the project improve access and quality of care to adults/and or children</b>	Yes – children in care will be discharged earlier as more appropriate supportive setting available.
<b>Is it deliverable by March 2020?</b>	Yes – a building owned by BCC has been identified for adaptation
