1. Clean and Green

An application has been submitted to the 'central pot' for the following clean and green projects:

Bulb planting - £546.25

- 5000 in the Lawrence Hill roundabout and approaches to the underpasses
- 5000 in the St Pauls round about (Ashley/Lawrence Hill) and approaches to the underpasses
- 1000 Clarence Road (Lawrence Hill) grassed area
- 500 Thompson Road (Lawrence Hill) green space to plant spring bulbs in the space and install a litter bin.

Signage for the middle of the Lawrence Hill roundabout - £300

Unlike the St Pauls underpasses there are no signs once you are inside the roundabout telling you where the underpasses lead to. Sign writer to make a directional sign for the middle of the roundabout.

Winter flowering window boxes – £510

To revamp the window boxes on some of the side streets off Stapleton Road (Walton Street, Villiers Road, Lansdown Road, part of Felix Road and Part of Chaplin Road).

'Garden of the Four Jewels' St Pauls Gardens (Ashley) - £750.00 Improve the planting at the Garden of the Four Jewels, St Pauls Gardens

Community Notice board on Old Market - £1,570 (plus VAT if external organisation pays)

St Pauls Community notice boards - £1,476

Replace two notice boards (junction of Stokes Croft and City Road and on the corner of City Road and Brigstock Road, directly in front of the St Pauls Settlement (Docklands)).

Easton and Lawrence Hill Community Notice boards £1260 (plus VAT if external organisation pay). To re-spray 14 notice boards that formerly belonged to Easton Residents Network.

We will know the outcome of the funding request at the end of September.

The Partnership are requested to take a decision on whether they wish to spend the contribution highlighted in blue, on local traffic management / highway measures, or whether they wish it to be applied to the King Street Bridge. If the former, then the contribution will remain devolved, however if the latter then it will move into the non-devolved spreadsheet. It should be noted that if King Street Bridge is to be implemented it is likely to require every available Section 106 contribution to be applied to it, as no other funding has currently been identified for it's delivery.
