Tackling inequality and deprivation

Much of the inner city ranks in the 10% most deprive areas with Lawrence Hill ranking the most deprived ward in the City. This means people are likely to experience more crime, poor health, early death, low income, and be disadvantaged from an early age. Tackling deprivation is a key challenge for the NP which will underpin all the NP's work.
