The Neighbourhood Partnership team have been very busy this quarter.

# 1. Engagement work - has included

Mobil Neighbourhood Forums at venues that attract young parents, these include, Shirehampton Play & Stay Toddler Group, Sea Mills Children's Centre, Peeps one, and Avonmouth C.C. twice. These are chances for over 25 young mums to tell us about issues that they experience with BCC services. These have been added to the you said we did work.

We also use these to consult on a variety of issues including at the Avonmouth venues parents were asked to complete the community First questionnaire, and at the Lawrence Weston Venues informing people about potential new parks and the chance to get involved.

2. **You said we did update** – performance management update to be tabled.

### 3. Youth Forum

The group, after consulting with over 60 of their peers set new Youth priorities for the NP area (Transport, Bullying, Drugs and Alcohol, Activities for Young People and Litter).

The N1 Youth Forum has had its first bidding round and allocated £400 on 10th July. The Group did not want to allocate the whole of the £6000 that has been given to them (£3000 from Well Being and a further £3000 from Children and Young Peoples Services) feeling that it would be prudent to hold on to some of it so that if there was a need after the new youth providers have been chosen (potentially a September start for new providers). The funds were available this bidding round were

- 1 x £1,000 grant to tackle transport issues for young people.
- 2x £500 grants for strategies to deal with substance misuse.
- 2 x £500 grants for anti bullying initiatives.
- 6 x up to £200 grants for local activities.
- 2 x £200 grants for tackling littering.

## 5. Community First Priorities 2012/14

Over the summer we have been busy consulting on what local priorities the Community First funding should be spent on. Thirty Three Thousand Pounds was allocated to Avonmouth Ward, a group of local people was set up to appraise the projects and the NP priorities were used to spend the first round of funds. After analysis of the 241 completed surveys (actually 318 but those from outside the area where not counted) we now have 6 new priorities and several new residents wanting to take an active role in the programme.

Priorities are with the number of votes

177	More activities for Children and young people
102	Community Events
100	Crime and antisocial behaviour
99	Sporting facilities/activities
95	More/improved community facilities
79	More activities for older people

The next bidding round will open on the 10<sup>th</sup> September with a close date of 8th October. There will be £6428 to allocate for spending in this financial year
