- He had requested a review of the proposed route of the Ashton Vale to Temple Meads route because he was concerned about the detrimental heritage, environmental and operational impacts on the harbourside railway, the harbourside itself and Prince Street bridge.
- 2. He had carefully considered the information in the report, looking particularly at the benefit to cost ratio, the risks and the professional advice in relation to the options. Set against this, he had considered the detrimental impact that would be caused by continuing with Option 1, which would see the route going over Prince Street Bridge.
- 3. In weighing up these considerations, he was of the view that pursuing an option that removed the significant detrimental impacts of Option 1 was justified on the evidence that he had considered and he therefore was resolving to pursue Option 2.

- 4. He added that since the equality impact assessment in relation to Option 1 identified that there may be an impact at the planning, construction and design stage of the project, that was likely also to be true of Option 2. Decisions in relation to the details of the programme would be taken by officers under delegated authority. However, for the avoidance of doubt, it was his expectation that officers would have regard to any adverse equality impact and, where reasonably practicable, take steps to mitigate that impact at the planning, construction and design stage.
- 5. He would also be instructing officers to consult with residents of Cumberland Road in relation to any mitigation / steps that were reasonable in terms of scheme design and implementation.
