That (subject to the business case being signed off) up to £15m funding be accepted from the West of England Local Enterprise Partnership by the Council to extend the Bristol is Open infrastructure to key locations within the West of England area. This award is made via the Local Growth Fund to deliver the 'Terabit West' project, which was included in the Strategic Economic Plan for the West of England.
