45.7/14 Cycling on Clifton and Durdham Downs (Agenda Item No. 6)

The Committee considered a report on the above.

Jon Usher introduced the report and summarised it for everyone. He noted that the recommendations are aimed at those who do not already cycle.

The following key issues were noted during the discussion that took place:

- Main routes are the priority for investment and the two main pedestrian routes across the Downs will become cycle tracks; the aim is for anyone living in Bristol to be within 500 metres of a cycle track
- Some Members, whilst supporting the principle of cycling, considered that the Downs should remain cycle free because of the potential clash with pedestrians; cycle routes could be adjacent to the edge of the Downs; it was noted that the RPZ may encourage people to cycle across the Downs
- There was agreement that the scheme should be progressed and that proposals should be considered at a future meeting

 Jon Usher confirmed that he would take the Committee's views back to the Sub Group

Resolved - (i) that the report be noted; and

(ii) that a further report on proposals be received at a future Meeting.

Income and Revenue Optimisation at the Downs (Agenda Item No. 10)

Peter Watts introduced this report and summarised it for everyone.

The following key issues were noted during the discussion that took place:

- It was noted that some events are controversial and it was agreed that a Sub Group be established to consider proposed events with the power to refer to the Committee; the group should operate primarily through e-mail; it was suggested that the Membership comprise the Lord Mayor, the Master, 1 Councillor and 1 Merchant Venturer
- It was confirmed that the Downs could be included in meetings relating to the Green Capital
- It should be publicised that all of the income from events on the Downs goes to support the Downs

Resolved - (i) that the relaxing of delegated powers be approved on the understanding that an Events Sub Group will initially inform any decision making regarding major events; the Sub Group Membership will comprise the Lord Mayor, the Master, 1 Councillor and 1 Merchant Venturer; the Group will operate primarily through e-mail and with the power to refer to the Committee; and

(ii) that suitable areas (or unsuitable areas) to market the Downs for increased event activity be identified.

Downs Management Report (Agenda Item No. 11)

Andrew Gordon introduced this report and summarised it for everyone.

The following key issues were noted during the discussion that took place:

- The second item of OTIS training equipment is to be the same as on Ladies Mile and could be allowed for 12 months initially
- Referring to the proposed movement of the BBQ are, it was noted that although Natural England have raised concerns their scientific case is challengeable and the soil can be tested for phosphate levels
- It was noted that although most authorities operate a blanket ban on BBQ's this was an area identified as being suitable and has been successful over the last 3 years
- It was agreed that Andrew Gordon and Becky Coffin would draft a letter to Natural England and include phosphate test results as part of the evidence
- It was noted that the Sea Walls situation is an on going problem for the Downs Committee and BCC; consideration is being given to buying the land below but the owner is asking for a large amount of money; it may be possible to arrange an exchange of land; the Committee will be kept aware of progress
- It was noted that consideration is being given to tendering for the non ice-cream concessions

Resolved - (i) that a second item of OTIS training equipment be allowed on the Downs for a period of 12 months;

- (ii) that the agreed location for the Oscar Tuazon temporary artwork be noted;
- (iii) that in relation to the proposal to move the BBQ area the scientific case put forward by Natural England be challenged and that a letter be sent to Natural England which includes phosphate test results of the soil be as part of the evidence;
- (iv) that the progress made by BCC Legal Services to try to

resolve issues with the neighbouring land owner at Sea Walls be noted; and

(v) that the proposals for ways of raising additional revenue on the Downs be considered.
