Feedback from the Clean and Green board

Dundry View Neighbourhood Partnership submitted an application for £4,800 out of the £29,000 citywide budget for the purchase of six litter bins to replace unsuitable bins currently within parks (small dog bins to be replaced with larger multi-use bins).

The application was turned down. At the meeting on 20th December 2011, the Dundry View Neighbourhood Committee resolved to put in a representation to the Clean and Green board to request that this decision was reconsidered due to the bins being replacement bins and therefore not incurring ongoing maintenance costs (which was the main reason for the application being turned down).

Following further information which has been provided to them, the Clean and Green board have now agreed to fund the replacement litter bins. Their initial decision not to support the application was that there was a query on whether the bins would incur additional maintenance costs, and a query on the original costings provided.

5. Devolved influence on parks and grounds maintenance contract

Influence over parks and grounds maintenance contracts was devolved to the Dundry View Neighbourhood Committee in September 2010.

During recent walkabouts in the Pigeonhouse Stream area in Whitchurch Park and Hartcliffe Wards, discussions took place about the maintenance of the area and to what level the vegetation should be cut back. Additionally, requests have been received for keeping the area cleaner.

Councillors Holland and Brain undertook a walkabout with the Area Environment Officer and agreed the following:

- Hawfield Road, up to the junction of Fulford Road it was agreed that some of the bramble adjacent to the road by the small tree copses could be cut back to be able to keep the bramble manageable. Where the grass verge is adjacent to the footpath, to cut back to approx. 0.5 m from the edge of the path. The vegetation beyond this is retained.
- Where Fulford Road footpath passes by Blackthorn Close to Whitchurch Lane keeping close the banks of the stream - some minimal cutting back of vegetation near the path was identified to reduce the hazard of it overgrowing the path, and to make it feel safer to walk there.
- Enquiries were made by Julian Cox through Safer Bristol to see if there had been any reported incidents of crime on persons walking in this area. There were none recorded.
- It was felt that there were adequate open areas to access the stream by children, and to clearly view the stream by anyone walking the area,

- without having to cut down more vegetation.
- Increasing planting in some areas on the banks was also discussed and will be considered further.
- The litter in the area needed to be cleared more regularly. Wooded areas are not currently litter-picked as part of the contract and the grassed areas were heavily littered. A request was made for a slight change to the schedule in this area so that the wooded areas are litterpicked, and that the grassed areas are litter-picked properly.
- Community Payback will do a two day deep clean of the area to get it up to standard, after this it is expected that Quadron will keep it clean as part of their contract.

The Area Environment Officer, Julian Cox, will make these requests on behalf of the Dundry View Neighbourhood Committee and will feed back progress at Pride of Place group and at Neighbourhood Partnership meetings.
