- d. Anticipated financial issues with 2012/13 Local Traffic Schemes:
 - i. As set out in Table b. above: £363.28 now remains uncommitted in the available budget following the anticipated overspend on Church Road scheme.
 - *The LSTF Fulford Road bid has offered £1,800 from the Local Traffic budget as match, as agreed at June NP meeting. This would create an overspend of £1,436.72 as the Church Road overspend means the unallocated money is largely now spent.
 - iii. There is a risk that the Church Road scheme might produce a larger overspend and/or other schemes could generate

unforeseen overspends

- iv. Options are being explored to deliver the Longway Avenue scheme which could deliver an underspend
- f. Potential ways of managing potential shortfalls:
 - i. The Neighbourhood Committee might want to reduce the allocation to minor signs and lines (£2,250)
 - ii. Proposals which Highways will bring forward for Longway Avenue will offer a range of methods of delivering the scheme at different costs/benefits which gives the Committee some flexibility to manage small overspends
 - iii. Depending on the decision on the Fulford Road LSTF bid, the Committee might draw any shortfall on match from the 2012/14 Local Traffic Budget
 - iv. The Neighbourhood Committee might want to explore any potential funding within existing Section 106 budgets which could supplement delivery of 2012/13 priority schemes

Note: An unforeseen underspend has been identified from the original costing quoted to the Partnership which offers an opportunity to get better value from the Amelia Nutt S106 funding.

The Amelia Nutt S106 funding for this work is: \pounds 18,878.09 plus \pounds 315 donation from Withywood Park Group = \pounds 19,193.09 total

The original budget for the Withywood Park work approved by the NP and confirmed at 27th June NP meeting was:

Play Park pod: £16,470 plus £400 tracking costs = £16,870 leaves: £2,323.09 cost of 4 bins was guoted at: £2,915, leaving a shortfall of £592

therefore the Committee agree to fund this short fall from Withywood Church S106.

The revised, updated costs now are:

Play Park pod: £13,208.40 (including the tracking costs) this is because the original quote included the revenue costs of Play Ranger sessions. This can't be charged to S106 and has now been picked by BCC play service budgets.

leaves: £5,984.69 cost of 4 bins now quoted at: £2,895 leaving: <u>£3089.69 Underspend</u>

Willmott Park proposal:

Willmott Park has some granite seating which has been badly damaged and needs removing and replacing and new bin liners installing. They've applied to Wellbeing for this. The quote from BCC landscapes is £3,047 for this work. As usual, these works also incur maintenance and bin emptying costs in addition to the cost of the items themselves. The Wellbeing assessment group agreed that it makes much more sense to pay for this from Section 106 as those maintenance costs are taken care of automatically. The suggestion is to pay for these items from the above underspend from Amelia Nutt S106.

Benefits

a. Willmott Park is a legitimate spend because it's within 1 mile radius of the Amelia Nutt site and it's a priority in the Parks Investment Plan.

b. This money has to be spent and the work in the ground by 22 November or it risks being lost so a swift delivery is needed. Wilmott Park upgrade is deliverable in this timescale - it's ready to go.

c. it makes the best use of getting the maintenance costs of Willmott Park

5. Neighbourhood Forums feedback

Neighbourhood Forums took place in all three wards during the week beginning 10th September. Issues raised will be tabled at the 24th September Neighbourhood Partnership meeting.

6. Bishopworth Pool Update

The Steering Group has met twice since the last Neighbourhood Partnership in June. The Group has agreed the following priorities for the next period:

- maintain oversight of the upkeep of the site
- Exploration of re-use potential of the existing building: A strong theme from consultation so far is the question of whether the building as it stands can be re-used. There are a number of ideas put forward about what these uses might be.
- Invitations will be distributed to all community/Voluntary sector groups and any relevant commercial organisations to view the building, discuss details with the city council and put in expressions of interest. This will establish to what degree there is a realistic potential use for the existing building
- Once this process has taken place the Steering Group will report back to the NP on its results. This will either keep the 're-use of the building' option alive or indicate that there is no realistic use for it and that it may need to be demolished
- A further process will then take place to explore a 'site cleared' range of

options and uses.

- The review of community facilities is continuing. The Group has heard from @ 15 organisations and is following up known missing responses. It will consider the results at its next meeting
- An article by Cllr Eddy was published in the latest WHAM explaining the current situation and the work of the Steering Group and updates have been delivered the September Hartcliffe and Bishopsworth Neigbhourhood Forums.
- Steering Group membership: the WHAM article asked for Hartcliffe residents to join the Steering Group and 3 people have contacted the HWCP office to express their interest.
- The Area Co-ordinator is following up the issue of potential devolution of the decision about the future of the site to the Neighbourhood Committee.
- 7. Crox Bottom Management Plan
 - The Management Plan is in final draft. It was discussed at the 10th September Pride of Place Group and the decision was taken to review it for a final time with members of the Friends of Crox Bottom Group for final 'tweaking'
 - This final review is particularly needed in order to maximise the opportunity of negotiating the use of £93,793.76 Section 106 from the Imperial Park development for 'The provision of a footpath / cycleway link across Crox Bottom to provide a link from the Headley Park Residential Area to the western edge of Imperial Park (adjacent to Big W) at a point to be agreed with the site owner.'
 - The use of this funding was frustrated initially because the Lakeside development blocked of the intended route of these link pathways. The Crox Bottom plan does propose the installation of new pathways but it's not explicit that they will necessarily deliver an effective pathway to link Headley Park and Imperial Park.
 - Once this is done the final version of the plan will be presented at the December NP meeting and a proposal will be forwarded to the Imperial Park developer through Jim Cliffe to seek approval for any identified use of the £93k S106.
- 8. Dundry View Action Plan Development
 - An outline development proposal to produce a new Action Plan for Dundry View NP will be tabled for discussion, amendment and

approval at the 24th September meeting.

- The Area Co-ordinator has met with Gill Brookman, the NHS Bristol Health Improvement Manager for South Bristol, to link the Dundry View Health Improvement Strategy into the Dundry View Action Plan. This Strategy is due to be ready in October and will be incorporated as the Health element of the Dundry View Action Plan.
- The Engagement/Communication plan has already been agreed by the Partnership and will also be the basis for the Action Plan.
- The Community Safety Delivery Plan presented at 24th September meeting will form a significant element of the Safer Communities Priority.
