7. Dundry View Bristol Youth Links Sub-Group meeting

At the 17th December Neighbourhood Partnership meeting the NP agreed to set up a sub-group to meet with Learning Partnership West, the new Bristol Youth Links provider.

8. Dundry View Action Plan Development

Workshops to develop the Action Plan were intended to take place in March but lack of capacity to deliver has meant that they will now take place in April.

The Action Plans for Community First can be delivered for the end of March 2013 using existing community priorities, and can be updated after the April workshops. This has been agreed with Community First.

9. Mayor's visit, Tuesday 26th March

The Mayor, George Ferguson, is visiting Dundry View on Tuesday 26th March to visit a range of community venues, groups and issues. The itinerary is attached at Appendix D.
