Proposals for spend reflect suggestions developed through Pride of Place Group, requests from ward Councillors and Forums. A number of suggestions were put forward at the 7th September Prioritisation event. The actions taken since the September NP will commit £865 of the £1,280 which was uncommitted at that meeting and puts the Partnership in a strong position to commit the remaining £415 by March 2013 and avoid any clawback of funding. 4.4 <u>s106 budget for libraries: £4,624.91</u>

The Library service reports the use of this funding as follows:

<u>Bishopsworth library</u> - Office Shredder; Book stands; Carpet; Big box on wheels; Magazine Rack; Roator Displayer; Table; Chairs

Hartcliffe library - Children's table; Chairs (2 sets); Trolley; Carpet; Laminator;

We also bought a comprehensive range of children's non-fiction and spent £1,960.34, buying a total of 268 items (134 per library)

The S106 money has made a difference to both branches. Having new items for customers to enjoy has created a much more of a welcoming space. In addition, the extra children's books have helped to diversify existing collections, and certainly have gone a long way to help promote reading and to support the children's increase in knowledge of the wider environment.

5. No carry-over of devolved Wellbeing, Clean and Green and Communication budgets into 2014/2015 - Update

- 5.1 All Neighbourhood Partnerships were asked to note that there will be no carry-over of unallocated funds from the following budgets into 2014/2015:
- Wellbeing (£30,000); Clean and Green (£1,500);
 Communications (£1,000)

NPs were asked to make concrete plans to ensure that decisions are in place to allocate these funds by March 2014.

5.2 **Wellbeing Fund**: Recommendations set out in the Wellbeing Paper will complete full allocation of the Fund if approved at the December NP meeting;

Clean and Green budgets: have been fully allocated in Bishopsworth and Whitchurch Park; nearly 50% of the Hartcliffe allocation has now been allocated and the remaining £415 will be recommended at either the December or January 2014 Pride of Place Group.

The **Communication budget** is held by the Area Co-ordinator. From the £1,000 allocated for 2013/2014. £890 remains. Plans are being developed to fund promotional materials to support the delivery of Neighbourhood Working priorities chosen by the Partnership and the Bishopsworth Pool consultation work.

6. Section 106 and Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL): latest position

6.1. There are no new S106 payments for Dundry View Neighbourhood Partnership at end August 2013. The remaining, unallocated S106 monies are:

Three options have been identified from the September walkabout for footway/cycling improvements within Crox Bottom that can plausibly meet this S106 allocation (provision of a footpath / cycleway link across Crox Bottom to provide a link from the Headley Park Residential Area to the western edge of Imperial Park).

These options have now been forwarded to the Parks Project Team to produce costings and delivery plans which can be considered by the Pride of Place Group and consulted on with local people before being brought to the February or March NP for a final approval.
