Introduction of 20mph work roll-out in Dundry View

Following two pilot projects in South and East Bristol which came into operation in 2010, the Council's Cabinet decided to roll out a 20 mph scheme across Bristol.

The 20 mph speed limits will help reduce road danger, making it safer for people to walk or cycle and improve local communities.

The scheme will be signs only – there will be no associated traffic calming works such as speed humps or chicanes. It is being rolled out in 6 phases, starting with the Centre and Inner North area which is due to come into force in January 2014. The Outer Ring South area, which includes Highridge, Bishopsworth, Withywood, Hartcliffe, Whitchurch Park, Whitchurch, Hengrove, and Stockwood, is due to be completed by February 2015.

Dual carriageways and roads which currently have 40 or 50 mph speed limits will be exempt. All other roads will be considered for 20 mph limits. We will be attending Neighbourhood Partnerships and Forums and providing displays in local community centres and libraries to explain and discuss the proposals. We will be asking residents to tell us which

roads they think should be excluded from the new speed limits. Following these initial discussions we will develop proposals and ask people to comment on them. We will notify all households to explain where they can see the proposals and how to comment.

Finally, we will produce a proposal to go out to formal consultation in October 2014.
