1. Devolved Highways Budgets Updates

1.1 See Item 6, Devolved Transport Budgets for 2014/15 Carriageway and footway resurfacing

1.2. Overspend on 2012/13 budget:

BCC Highways undertook at the 24th June 2013 NP meeting to cover a minimum of £6,000 of this overspend of £8,424.76 from their mainstream budget.

1.3. 2013/2014 Local Traffic Schemes budget:

The £25,714 allocation for 2013/14 (less the allocation for Minor Signs and Lines approved at 24th June 2013 NP) is rolled forward and combined with the 2014/15 allocation. The Transport sub-group is holding the long list of potential schemes from which recommendations will be put to the NP for decision.

1.4.1. Potential 2014/2015 Local Traffic Schemes

Total **potential** available budget: £25,714 + £23,464 2013/14 budget = **£49,178**

1.4.2. The Transport Group met on 13th November 2013 and asked Highways to cost up a number of schemes to present for a final decision to the NP meeting in March 2014. However **Item 6** is presenting the NP with a changed context for decisions and seeking where possible a three-year programme.

Recommendation: That the Transport Group re-considers potential local Traffic Schemes at its May meeting and brings a new set of

recommendations to the July NP for decision.

1.5 Narrow Estate Roads

Dundry View may not receive Narrow Estate Road funding in future as the future of this budget is still not decided.

The Transport Group has the city-wide list of identified Narrow Estate roads and is identifying potential schemes to put forward, should this budget continue to be offered to address narrow estate road issues.

2.1: Active Travel Grants, Round 3

The Area Co-ordinator is aware of 1 Active Travel Grant application for the 3rd round for work in the Dundry View area. It has been submitted by CSV to set up a programme of 4 road closures around schools at pick-up time and to turn the road into play spaces for the pupils and their families. The aim is to encourage walking to school and to get parents to experiment with leaving their vehicles.

This scheme can complement the Neigbourhood Working priority set by the partnership to address problem parking around schools.



- 4.3. Proposal to allocate funding from Withywood Methodist Church S106
 - 4.3.1 £10,951.68 S106 is available from the Withywood Methodist Church site for 'The provision of improvements to Parks and Open Spaces within one mile of the former Withywood Methodist Church'

4.3.2 The parks and open spaces which are eligible to benefit from this s106 are illustrated in the map below:

4.3.3 At the Pride of Place Group meeting on 10th March 2014 the Group considered the following proposal to upgrade seating, bins and signage in Kings Head Lane Park and Withywood Park. It includes provision to resolve drainage issues on the land outside the Play Pod which the Partnership funded with a previous S106 spend:

- 4.3.4 This proposal fits into the following identified priorities in the Dundry View Parks Improvement Plan: New or improved seating; New and improved information boards and signage; Improved lighting and bins
- 4.3.5 An alternative option was proposed to fund signage and entrance improvements to the western Dundry Slopes
- 4.3.6 The Pride of Place Group voted to recommend the Kings Head Lane and Withywood Park proposal as follows:

For: 10; Against: 1; Abstention: 1

- 4.3.7 The Group asked to Area Co-ordinator to develop an improved procedure to shape any future allocation of funding so that all potential proposals were able to present a costed set of options for consideration in advance
- 4.3.8 Equalities impacts: no formal Equalities Impact Assessment has been undertaken on this proposal. The improvements proposed sit under the **Improving accessibility for all user groups** section of the Parks Improvement Plan.
- Seating improvements are expected to improve the accessibility of the Park for disabled, elderly and families with small children.

- Additional bins should reduce littering and provide resource to help dog walkers dispose of dog mess, improving the park for use by children and families, elderly and disabled people
- signage/notice boards encourage the development of events and activities in the spaces
- improved drainage will benefit young people by making the ground by the Play Pod useable for more of the year
- There are no anticipated negative impacts from this proposal for any Equalities group or group with protected characteristics

Recommendation: That the Neighbourhood Committee approves the allocation of £9,805.84 to fund the Park improvements in Kings Head Lane Park and Withywood Park set out in 4.3.3

4.4 <u>s106 budgets for transport: £498,171.71</u>

The table below describes updates on all Section 106 funds which have been approved by the Neighbourhood Committee.

Future recommendations for s106 spend will be discussed and forwarded as recommendations from the Transport Sub-Group.

The devolved public and sustainable transport budgets (£338,735.97) have been considered by the Transport Subgroup of the Neighbourhood Partnership. The transport subgroup have worked with council officers and have agreed recommendations to the Neighbourhood Committee.

5. No carry-over of devolved Wellbeing, Clean and Green and Communication budgets into 2014/2015 - Update

- 5.1 All Neighbourhood Partnerships were asked to note that there will be no carry-over of unallocated funds from the following budgets into 2014/2015:
- Wellbeing (£30,000); Clean and Green (£1,500);
 Communications (£1,000)

NPs were asked to make concrete plans to ensure that decisions are in place to allocate these funds by March 2014.

5.2 **Wellbeing Fund**: Fund is fully committed.

Clean and Green budgets: have been fully allocated in Bishopsworth and Whitchurch Park; the remaining Hartcliffe £415 has been allocated (see paragraph 3).

The **Communication budget** is held by the Area Co-ordinator. £890 remains from the £1,000 allocated for 2013/2014. £200 has supported the delivery of the Bishopsworth Pool consultation work. This leaves £690 remaining, which is likely not to be spent in time.

6. Section 106 and Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL): latest position

6.1. There are no new S106 payments for Dundry View Neighbourhood Partnership at end January 2014. The remaining, unallocated S106 monies are:

Four options have been identified from the September walkabout for footway/cycling improvements within Crox Bottom that can plausibly meet this S106 allocation (provision of a footpath / cycleway link across Crox Bottom to provide a link from the Headley Park Residential Area to the western edge of Imperial Park).

These options have now been forwarded to the Highways for feasibility work to produce costings and delivery plans which can be considered by the Pride of Place Group and consulted on with local people before being brought to the July NP for a final approval.
