1b. Carriageway and footway resurfacing

Carriageway surface dressing budget 2014-15 is £120,250:

Highways have reported that all the surface dressing for the area has been completed this includes roads such as Keeble Avenue, Highridge Road and Four Acres. Ongoing sweeping will continue to rid the roads of excess chippings and then the roads will have their markings replaced.

Footway maintenance budget is £63,000:
