**1. Overall Performance**

The above reflects levels of crime reported to Police across all three wards at the end of Jan 2015. We continue to see a reduction in dwelling burglaries, and increase in detection rates, which is very welcome (and somewhat against the trend for other areas of South Bristol). Individual figures per ward are shown below.

Pc Susan Appleby has left the constabulary to take up a post coaching the England Womens National Rugby sevens side – look out for her at the Olympics in Brazil next year (so long as they qualify). Suzie will be replaced by PC Jayne Cranmer, who should again be joining us early April.
