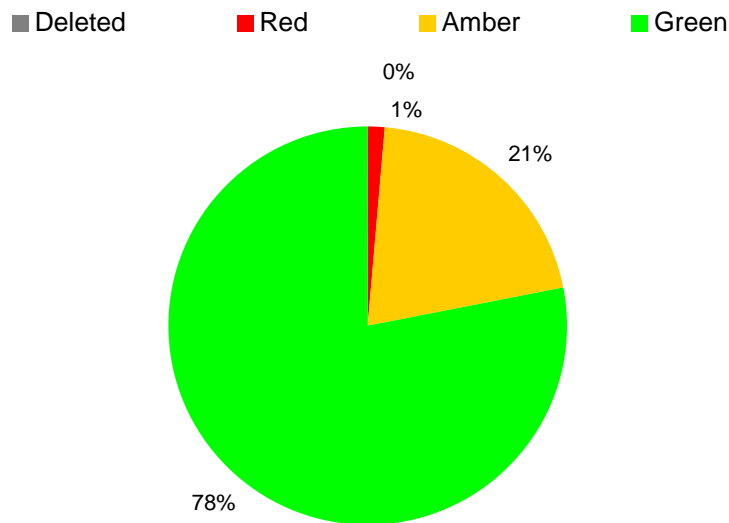
1. Neighbourhood Partnership Action Plan Update. See Appendix A.

Following the adoption of the Filwood, Knowle and Windmill Hill Neighbourhood Partnership Action Plan on 7 June 2011, the Area Coordinator produced an update document that shows progress on delivering the agreed actions.

Red, Amber and Green traffic lights are used to show progress on delivering actions against timescales to date.

This update shows that much has been achieved over the last period, but there is still more left to do. The sections that show the most weakness are still Planning and Development, and Communication.

NP Action Plan Progress



I will be working to address outstanding Communication actions as a matter of urgency (see point 2), but concluding the Planning and Development actions remains outside of the partnerships control.

There has been much progress made on Planning and Development actions but more must be done to ensure that a cohesive Knowle West Regeneration Framework is completed that encompasses its starting aims and objectives.

I also propose that the NP holds a special meeting mid February 2012 to identify its strategic priorities for 2012-13.

2. Communication Plan

Following slow progress on moving the Neighbourhood Partnership communications agenda forward, I would like to propose a sub-group be established to examine what can be done to improve communication for the partnership. The proposed meeting date for the communications sub-group is 6-7.30 pm Tuesday 24 January 2012 with venue to be confirmed.

3. Neighbourhood Forum Meeting Updates

- Filwood Broadway including Coral Bookmakers/Community Centre and Barnstaple Court - Youths congregating at Coral Bookmakers, the community centre and Barnstaple court causing ASB and Criminal damage to the surrounding area
- Eagle House Community Centre - Young Adults causing damage to the Building and surrounding area, ASB, Drug and Alcohol misuse

- Bayham Road – No Entry Zone
Vehicles have been contravening the No Entry sign, usually during morning and afternoon rush hours
- Polden House – ASB/Drugs
Youths have been gathering in the communal areas and taking drugs. They are leaving drugs litter and causing general ASB
- Totterdown
Residents are unhappy with bins being left on pavements blocking wheelchair/pushchair access and being left abandoned after the collection has been made

4. Landlord Services Update

Following the closure of the Knowle Cash Desk, Salcombe Road, on 16 December 2011, BCC Landlord Services will also close the Knowle Customer Service Point (CSP) and Bedminster (Redcliffe Hill) CSP on 3 and 24 February 2012 respectively.

It is proposed that customers will access services at the remaining CSPs such as Symes House, Hartcliffe and Phoenix Court, Bond Street, or by telephone or online. Following the closure of Knowle and Bedminster BCC Landlord Services further propose that CSP surgeries will be held either one or two days per week in Bedminster, Knowle and Filwood libraries.

5. Community Buildings Audit

The Neighbourhood Partnership has been asked to participate in a Community Buildings Audit. This audit will look at the coverage of community buildings in Filwood, Knowle and Windmill Hill with the particular aims of creating an accurate and complete record of community buildings, identifying community building needs for each ward, identifying gaps in or over provision of community buildings, and agreeing community building aspirations for the short, medium and long term.

This work will begin in February with the BCC Community Buildings Manager, and meeting dates will be provided closer to then. Agreed 4th October 2011

1. Alcohol related Anti Social Behaviour and Sex Litter, Redcatch Park.

Mainly youths congregating drinking alcohol, causing a nuisance to local residents and leaving sex litter. Peak times of occurrence are Friday and Saturday evenings.

- * Regular patrols by the beat team
- * Identify peak times of offending – Complete 4th October 2011.
- * Daily liaison with the park keeper
- * Maintained contact with local Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinators
- * Attendance at the local Friends of Redcatch Park meeting in order to raise awareness with regard to the priority and ways of reporting incidents
- * Continued proactive work with the Youth Club
- * Plain clothed patrols by beat managers
- * Any offenders to have their details taken and anti-social behaviour reports submitted
- * Positive action regarding alcohol consumption in the Alcohol Free Zone
- * Communication to be made with local football teams to remind them and their supporters of the Alcohol Free Zone

2. Parking on the Pedestrian Crossing, Wells Road.

Parking on the zigzags of the pedestrian crossing outside of Miss Millie's, Subway, Superdrug, PDSA, The Children's Society, Lloyds Pharmacy, Bet Fred, The Talbot Steakhouse, St Peter's Hospice Shop and Flowers Galore, especially after 6pm. (continuation of previous priority)

- * Local businesses to be made aware that the issue has been raised as a priority again
- * Posters have been handed out as per previous priority
- * Visual audit of businesses around the crossing, replacing any lost posters
- * Continued regular patrols and enforcement

Damage to vehicle tyres in the Rookery Road/Clyde Road/Clyde Terrace/Sydenham Road areas.

- * Liaise with local shops
- * Liaise with The Mede
- * Use CCTV
- * Target persistent offenders – ASB letters
- * Issue Street drinkers with a direction to leave the area for a period of time (Section 27 violent crime reduction Act)
- * Make enquiries with Licensing regarding the sale of Alcohol to the Street Drinkers

2. Filwood Broadway including Coral Bookmakers/Community Centre and Barnstaple Court - Youths congregating at Coral Bookmakers, the community centre and Barnstaple court causing ASB and Criminal damage to the surrounding area

Actions:

- * Regular police patrols
- * Liaise with district focus team
- * Liaise with caretaker at Barnstaple Court
- * Letters to persistent offenders – ASB letters
- * Youths not living at location to be removed (Barnstaple Court)
- * Regular visits to the Bookmakers to provide reassurance
- * Visits to the community Centre
- * Contact youth services
- * Utilise CCTV to target offenders

3. Eagle House Community Centre - Young Adults causing damage to the Building and surrounding area, ASB, Drug and Alcohol misuse

Actions:

- * Regular Police Patrols
- * Liaise with Community Centre and youth Scheme
- * Utilise their CCTV
- * Liaise with Street wise co-ordinator regarding Alcohol and drug misuse
- * Liaise with Bristol Drug Squad

Outcomes

1. Marshall Walk

19/11/11/ - Liaised with local shop keepers and discussed problems and plan of action to tackle street drinking.

02/12/2011 - High visibility patrol of Marshall Walk – street drinkers spoken to and moved on. Alcohol seized from a group of under 18s. Section 27 violent crime disorder act notice issued to one member of the group. She was asked to leave the area and not return for 48 hours. All paperwork submitted to Police ASB team.

2. Broadway including Coral Bookmakers/ / community Centre and Barnstaple Court – 21 Votes

12/11/11 – Meeting at Filwood Community Centre with members from Youth Opinions and local young people discussing plans for Filwood.

21/11/11 – CCTV operators seen youths throwing stones at an address on Barnstaple Court. Police attended location and spoke with young people and two arrested for criminal damage.

09/12/11 - High visibility patrol Filwood Broadway and Barnstaple Court. Staffs at Corals Bookmakers were spoken to.

3. Eagle House Community Centre

11/11/11 – Group of 5 youths outside of the centre, youths were moved away and alcohol confiscated.

18/11/11 - Joint visit with Bristol City Council housing officer - visited youths and young men who have recently caused Anti-social behaviour in Eagle House car park.

22/11/2011 – Meeting held between Bristol City Council young people services and police to discuss ASB prevention measures at Eagle House.

02/12/2011 - High visibility patrol of Newquay Road and Eagle House.
