### 1. Background

The Environment Sub Group was formed in the summer of 2013 with the remit to improve and enhance the local environment within the Greater Bedminster Community Partnership. The first task of the group was to walk the green spaces within the GBCP area to familiarise themselves with green spaces and other areas not familiar to them.

The group has met several times however the last meeting took place in January 2014. The Area Environment Officer who was leading the group – Deborah White – has now left Bristol City Council.

Although the group has not met up for a few months, they did start to create an action plan and put forward a couple of priorities to kick start the process of spending some of the S106 money that is currently allocated to the GBCP.

A priority wheel exercise was undertaken and the following priorities were considered to input into the wider action plan that needs to be finalised.

#### 2. Priorities

The 2 priorities that the group considered needed pursuing in the first instance was:

- Developing children's play area in Ashton Vale
- Developing the Green Walkways

BCC officers were tasked to investigate against these priorities and provide feedback to the GBCP. There have been a number of community meetings in Ashton Vale since the summer of 2013 and there has been a lot of feedback regarding a proposed Children's Play area in Ashton Vale.

A number of sites have been looked at however to progress further, the GBCP needs to formally prioritise the development of a play area in Ashton Vale so that work can continue to take place.

Appendix A shows the draft Action Plan and S106 monies held by BCC that can be spent on improvements attributed to Parks and Open Spaces.

## 3 Introducing Dan

Our new Neighbourhood Officer covering the Greater Bedminster Community Partnership is Dan Judges. Dan will work closely with the Area Coordinator to re-establish the Environment Sub Group and finish the action plan that has been started.
