5.1. Parks s106 budgets

At the NP meeting on 17th October, the Neighbourhood Committee agreed a Parks Investment Plan for the NP area.

The Greater Brislington Environment Group had its first meeting in on 16th November 2012. Around 20 people attended the meeting. The group considered the parks investment plan and prioritised projects for parks officers to estimate costs and do site visits for. The priorities are outlined below

Brislington West Ward - Hungerford Road Open Space

• Children's Play Ground – highest priority

Brislington West Ward - Arnos Park

BMX track is a priority

Brislington East Ward - St Anne's Wood & Nightingale Valley

- Improved accessibility and entrances is the highest priority
- Community/Volunteer Opportunities
- St Anne's Well explore archaeological aspect

Brislington East Ward - Eastwood Road Children's Play Ground

Poor lighting needs to be addressed

Brislington East Ward - Victory Park

- Entrance improvement cantilever system
- Promote wildflower meadows
- Bonville Road entrance is a priority

The costs are due to be ready for the next environment group meeting which is at 6.30pm, 8th February 2012 at Arnos Vale Cemetery.

The group will consider the costs and the available s106 funding with a view to making some recommendations for investment to the Neighbourhood Committee in March 2012.

5.2. Transport s106 budgets

a. Water Lane s106 transport budget £85,042.30

At the NP meeting in October, the Neighbourhood Committee agreed to use this budget to invest in a path improvement scheme for public right of way 466 to include improvements to the path, new fencing and new lighting. The Neighbourhood Committee were presented with two schemes, one of which depended on a land transfer from Tesco, and a back up scheme in case the land transfer did not progress.

Tesco have not progressed with the land transfer so the team are pressing ahead with reconstructed the current path, improving the fencing and installing the lighting. The 'dodgy' bend that is falling into the river will also be stabilised to prevent further collapse. Notice will be served on Tesco to remove their fence that encroaches onto council land so extra use can be made of the extra width it will create.

The Environment Agency have been advised of a change of plan and that we are now looking at maintenance of the current path rather than a complete new path scheme, officers are optimistic that the council will not require their full consent which means we can start work onsite towards the end of January.

There was a lot of interest in the sort of fence that was going to be installed along the brook and a simple timber post and rail fence up to 1.2m high has been chosen. This will be sympathetic to the surroundings and will be a vast improvement on the current tumbledown chainlink.

b. Wooton Park / Callington Road s106 transport budget £31,159See agenda item 5

During the work being undertaken to identify possible local traffic schemes for 2012-2013, requests have been put forward for which other s106 devolved budgets could be used. It is proposed that the remaining s106 devolved budgets are considered alongside the local traffic schemes and footway schemes at the 19th March NP meeting.
