Title: Wellbeing Budget Report

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RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Neighbourhood Committee approves the recommendations from the Brislington Wellbeing panel for the allocation of Wellbeing Funding.

That the Neighbourhood Committee considered whether to accept and make a decision about the late application from St Anne's Parish Church.

- 1. The Greater Brislington Neighbourhood Partnership has £11,376.73 available funding in the Wellbeing Budget.
- 2. The Greater Brislington Neighbourhood Partnership has a Wellbeing Panel that meets to discuss funding applications received and to make recommendations to the Neighbourhood Committee for allocating the funding. The panel is made up of local residents and councillors.
- 3. At the panel meeting on 4th January 2012 the panel agreed that all of this year's budget should be committed by March 2012, and agreed to stretch the funding limit of £2,000 if appropriate, as well as considering allocating money to supplement Neighbourhood Partnership aims if not enough applications were received.
- 4. The panel met again on 29th February 2012 and made the recommendations contained in the table below:

5. Up to £7,922.64 is recommended for funding, which leaves at least £3,454.09 to be carried over to 2012-13 Wellbeing fund. Carrying over funds has been permitted for this year, but this is not guaranteed for future years.

Legal Information

When councillors decide how the wellbeing fund is spent they should have due regard to the public sector equality duty that applies to all public bodies. This duty is contained in the Equality Act 2010 and came in to force on 6 April 2011. It replaces previous equality duties under the Sex Discrimination, Race Relations and Disability Discrimination Acts.

The duty means that councillors are required to have due regard to the need to:

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation and other conduct prohibited under the Act
- Promote equality of opportunity between different groups
- Foster good relations between people from different groups

The duty covers the following protected characteristics:

• Disability, Sexual orientation, Age, Gender reassignment, Religion and belief; Sex, Race, Pregnancy and maternity.

It also applies to marriage and civil partnership, but only in respect of the requirement to eliminate discrimination and harassment.
