<u>1. Recorded Crime</u> – 1st April 2013 to 31st August 2013 (Against same period for 2012)

Reducing theft of vehicle registration plates

To respond to small rises in the levels of car registration plates being stolen, officers from the Brislington Neighbourhood Police Teams, the Safer Homes (formerly the 'Bobby Van' scheme) team and Safer Bristol carried out some events at local supermarkets.

Customers were offered free 'tamper-proof number plate screws' to be installed on their vehicles whilst they waited (or shopped). This took place at Tesco extra, Callington Road and Asda, Oatlands Avenue (Hengrove) which was of direct benefit to residents of Brislington and other parts of South Bristol. In total over 120 vehicles were secured. Residents were also registered on 'Immobilse' to catalogue and protect their belonings, and signed up to the Police mailing list.

Community confidence

Last year a pilot project was carried out in the Brislington East & West wards to disseminate positive messages about crime and disorder levels in the area, in a bid to increase confidence among the community (Brislington East & West showed up as 'cold spots' where perceptions of crime did not match reality).

It is difficult to conclusively judge how successful these measures were in 2012 as we are reliant purely on the results of the 2012 Quality of Life survey, however but we are planning a similar exercise this year. The plan is to disseminate specific messages in leaflet form as well as through email and word of mouth.

3. Community Priorities for last 6 months

March 2013

- Graffiti tag of 'WONG' on Broomhill Road and surrounding area.
 Action Offences investigated, no suspects identified.
- Inappropriate riding of motorcycles over the pavement between Runnymead Avenue and Callington Road Action – As May below.

May 2013

- HGV vehicles contravening weight limit on West Town Lane.
 Action Patrols, educating identified offenders.
- Motorcycles and mopeds riding over pavement between Callington Road and Runnymead Avenue.
 - Action Patrols, education/enforcement action taken against identified offenders. Highways looking at long term solution.
- Suspected drug misuse in wooded area behind houses on Wick Road, accessed from service road entrance by the former Wicklea Youth Centre. Action – Patrols. Unauthorised structure used as meeting area identified and removed.

July 2013

- Speeding Callington Road between Tesco roundabout and West Town Lane.
 Action Speed enforcement team tasked.
- Speeding Birchwood Road near top of the hill near to junction of Jersey Avenue.

Action – Speed enforcement team tasked.
