## Community Safety Officer Delivery Agreement 2012 - 2013

Greater Fishponds

Safer Bristol Community Safety Officer

- Safer Bristol will work with the Neighbourhood Partnership to develop its Action Plan around community safety priorities (crime/disorder, drugs and alcohol harm and anti social behaviour) and deliver a programme of work in 2012/2013 to address the community safety issues identified through the Action Plan.
- Safer Bristol will report back on this Agreement at a NP meeting once a year, the date to be agreed by the NP.
- The Community Safety Officer acts as a single point of contact to wider Safer Bristol services and support for the Neighbourhood Partnership. The CSO will work within the NP area to gather local priorities to help inform the production of the Neighbourhood Profile within Safer Bristol's annual Crime & Disorder Strategic Assessment.
- The CSO acts as the problem-solving advisor to the NP, using the ID PARTNERS problem-solving process. The development of Problems Solving Plans (PSP's) feature in this document. The CSO will provide briefings on the Problem Solving Process on request.
- The CSO will support the delivery of Neighbourhood Forums and the forum process, tackling crime and community safety issues raised when appropriate.
- The CSO will work with communities and partners to resolve community issues around Crime and Community Safety as identified through NP groups, other local groups and residents.

## Community Safety Priorities for the area:

The Safer Bristol Strategic Assessment provides recommendations for crime and disorder issues that need to be tackled by the Neighbourhood Delivery Teams (NDT) across Bristol. The recommendations for the Greater Fishponds area are:

- To reduce property crime: namely burglaries and vehicle crime.
- To reduce incidents of anti-social behaviour; with a key focus to reduce the impact of street sex work but also addressing the harm caused by other forms of behaviour that cause distress to people living and working in the Greater fishponds area.

We are also keen to encourage the active involvement of as many residents as possible in making Greater Fishponds safer, as they know the needs of their own neighbourhoods and this will help ensure that the issues we are working to address are those that matter most to local people.

**Recorded Crime:** Total recorded crime increased in the Neighbourhood Partnership area by 8% in the first three quarters of 2011/2012 compared with the same period the previous year. The police recorded a total of 6373 incidents in 2010/11.

**Recorded ASB:** In 2010/11 there were 2662 incidents of anti-social behaviour reported in the Neighbourhood Partnership area. There has been 2004 in 2011/2012 (April – December) representing a decrease of 4% compared with the same period the previous year.

**Tackling Street Sex Work**: Targeted work by the Police in Eastville in the last year has led to the following numbers of interventions with people involved in street sex work:

**2010/2011** Kerb Crawling: 132 Loitering: 25 Men Attending Change Course: 113

**2011/12 (Apr- Dec)** Kerb Crawling: 207 Loitering: 64 Men Attending Change Course: 111

The most common Neighbourhood Forum issues across the NP area are: Street Sex Work, traffic and parking, litter and flytipping.

Greater Fishponds Neighbourhood Partnership's Action Plan highlights a number of actions around community safety and crime prevention and features many of the perennial problems in the area for residents. Priority themes that complement the NDT action plan include burglary reduction, tackling the problems associated with street sex work and the reduction of ASB.
