4. MINUTES OF 27TH SEPTGEMBER 2012

AGREED - that the minutes of the meeting held on 27th September 2012 be approved and signed by the Chair.

5. MATTERS ARISING

Overview and Scrutiny Management Committee – Call-In Sub-Committee

Several members of the Partnership sought clarification of the issues considered as part of the Sub-Committees deliberations.

AGREED - that the minutes of the Overview and Scrutiny Management Call-in Sub Committee be circulated to the Neighbourhood Partnership.

6. GREATER FISHPONDS AREA NEIGHBOURHOOD PARTNERSHIP GFNP REPORT

The Neighbourhood Partnership received a report (Agenda Item No. 5), which updated the Partnership on progress since the last meeting.

During discussions on the Charter, Councillor Alexander asked that councillors be kept informed of meetings considering the charter.

It was noted that the Area Environmental Officer presented a draft Neighbourhood Waste Plan to the last meeting of the Environment Sub-Group, and it was anticipated that this would be considered at the March meeting of the Partnership.

Greater Fishponds NP area is in Phase 4 of the proposed phasing of the 20mph rollout across the city. This is expected to take place from December 2014.

John Moore, indicated that Health were in favour of 20 mph zones.

The Transport Planning team agreed to engage well in advance in order to have meaningful consultation with the local community via the Neighbourhood Forums and NP engagement plan.

AGREED:

- (1) that the updated GFNP brochure be noted;
- (2) that Mark Logan and Leigh Cooper be appointed as the Greater Fishponds representatives to work with BCC to develop a Neighbourhood Charter;

- (3) that progress update from the Environment sub-group be noted; and
- (4) that accident data supporting the roll out of the 20 mph zones be distributed; and
- (5) that progress from the Planning sub-group be noted.

7. GFNP VISION STATEMENT

The Neighbourhood Partnership received a report (Agenda Item No. 6) setting out the GFNP vision statement.

Following a detailed discussion, which accepted the general principles behind the draft vision/mission statement, it was
