- 1. The Wellbeing Panel met on Monday 17th February 2014 and assessed in total 12 applications. Summary appraisal sheets are shown in appendices 1 to 12.
- 2. At the meeting the panel was made aware of the Barton Field's application, which they previously recommended for approval and was deferred from the last NP meeting on Thursday 19th December 2013.

Part 4: The NP is asked to note applications supported from contingency.

- 3. In June 2010, the partnership agreed to process applications from local community groups, which qualify for "exceptional circumstance" criteria. Maximum amount groups could apply for was caped to £1,000 and the maximum amount that can be processed was restricted to £3,000. The purpose is to support local community groups who wish to organise a community event/activity under very tight timescales.

5. Total amount of Wellbeing Budget available is £7,279.30. There is not enough money available to support all the applications received for this round, which amount to £28,728.20. However if Neighbourhood Committee approves the Wellbeing Panel's recommendation of £7,283 and £1,125 from 2014/15 Wellbeing Budget. The Greater Fishponds Neighbourhood Partnership will have committed all the 2013/14 Wellbeing Budget and will commit £1,125 from the 2014/15 Wellbeing budget, subject to funding becoming available.

Legal Information

When councillors decide how the wellbeing fund is spent they should have due regard to the public sector equality duty that applies to all public bodies. This duty is contained in the Equality Act 2010 and came in to force on 6 April 2011. It replaces previous equality duties under the Sex Discrimination, Race Relations and Disability Discrimination Acts.

The duty means that councillors are required to have due regard to the need to:

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation and other conduct prohibited under the Act
- Promote equality of opportunity between different groups
- Foster good relations between people from different groups

The duty covers the following protected characteristics:

- Sexual orientation

- Gender reassignment
- Religion and belief
- Sex
- Race
- Pregnancy and maternity

It also applies to marriage and civil partnership, but only in respect of the requirement to eliminate discrimination and harassment.
