1. NP Plan Theme: Environment

Activity/Description	Cost to date £	Update
1.1 Priority 1: The NP area is clean, tidy and	well mainta	ined.
Activity 4: Enforcement in hotspot location Fishponds Road and Lodge Causeway (Eastville Park, Old Station Rd)		Officers targeted Grove Rd, which has now been identified as a new hotspot location. Section 47 Notices given to Fishponds Pizza and Grill, International Stores and Nazar Restaurant. These were in relation to how and where waste is stored. African Restaurant was also approached and as a result removed their bin and placed it in a secure area. All other businesses have been visited and their waste procedures are in order. A letter were sent to all flats above the shops advising how waste is to be presented and penalties if this is not complied with. Operations team were advised to treat this area as a hot spot site. Visits are made at least weekly by crew to remove waste and search for evidence. To date one piece of evidence was received and am awaiting a reply from a warning letter sent.
Activity 5: Aesthetically improve with flower baskets and flower meadows key locations: The junction 2 roundabout/Straits Parade/Lodge Causeway/ upper Fishponds Shopping area/Lower Fishponds Rd shopping area and Lodge Hill.	£5,000 + £2,500	There is a strong support for winter planters for Fishponds Rd & Lodge Causeway shopping districts.
