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1. Purpose of this Paper

To facilitate agreement on the Health and Wellbeing Work Programme for 2013/14 in order that the Board can fulfil its leadership role.

2. Context

- 2.1 The Health and Wellbeing Board (HWB) has the potential to be one of the most influential strategic bodies working for the health of Bristol. However, in order to fulfil its leadership role, and to 'shape and influence' rather than 'be informed of' the Board must be confident that it is influencing at key points during the planning cycles of its partner organisations.
- 2.2 The work programme needs to provide the opportunity for timely engagement with developing strategies, plans and programmes across the NHS and the Council.
- 2.3 This work programme will not be 'set in stone' but will provide the opportunity to prepare collectively for key priority items.
- 2.4 The Health and Wellbeing Strategy item on this agenda proposes that the 12 priorities within the Strategy are programmed into forthcoming Board meetings. Three of these items have been included in the Work Programme.

3. Key risks and Opportunities

The HWB has the potential to be one of the most influential strategic bodies working for the health of Bristol. The risk of not realising this potential needs to be mitigated by strategic planning.
