Item 2: Community Environment Budget

- 2.1. At the 14th July meeting the NP agreed to allocate a total of £5,000 to a Community Environment Budget from its Neighbourhood Budget for 2015/16. This budget is devolved to the Neighbourhood Partnership Co-ordinator for deployment. This fund is to be allocated in consultation with the Councillors on the NP and to be reported back and formally approved at each subsequent NP
- 2.2 The focus of this Fund will support the following elements within the NP Plan:
 - Support work of SEARCH & SEA groups to improve streetscene and environment through walkabouts and campaigns/Clean-ups
 - o Support the 'Be Proud of BS10' 'litter/dog mess reduction campaign'
 - o Support community groups and residents to enhance the appeal of streets through wildlife-friendly planting and growing in public space
- 2.3. In accordance with the above resolution the Neighbourhood Co-ordinator is reporting the following expenditure from the Community Budget

Item 3: Highways Schemes updates

- 3.1 The Traffic and Transport Sub-Group met on Wednesday 4th November.
- 3.2 Highways costing are still to be completed but underspend was indicated on Swanmoor/Charlton/Brentry scheme (see c & d below)
- 3.3 A problem has arisen subsequent to this meeting with the linking of the delivery of the Okebourne traffic calming work (funded from the second round of the Local Sustainable Transport/ Investing in Bristol's Future Fund) with this NP scheme. Although it made sense operationally all parties lost sight that Investing in Bristol's Future Fund granted £25,000 specifically for a speed platform. The local resident who worked to put together a bid into this fund for that purpose is very concerned that this funding could be lost and that the scheme so far hasn't delivered the speed table.
- 3.4 Cllr Mark Weston and NP Co-ordinator are working with Highways and the resident to consider the best way to resolve this problem.
- 3.5 The Traffic and Transport Sub-Group has put forward the following recommendations to the Neighbourhood Partnership to take forward long-standing schemes for potential funding decisions:
- a. Develop a preliminary assessment for Crow Lane Parking AND
- b. Develop an 'implementation-ready study' for Crow Lane mini-roundabout

In addition the Highways Officer has estimated:

c. - Cotrith Gardens Narrow Esate Road parking scheme: @ £13,000. This cost could be shared with BCC Housing if local authority residents supported it as this road is Housing Land. This would have to be explored in 2016/17 if the NP wanted to prioritise this scheme.

A Prioritisation exercise to determine the final year Highways scheme the NP wants to adopt will take place in February 2016 to consider the above projects and others to put a recommendation to the March 2016 NP meeting.

3.6 Southmead Hospital: The Informal Consultation on potential parking measures took place between 16th October and 13th November. Every household within the survey area received a questionnaire. Two drop-in events were held in

Badocks Wood School and Horfield Leisure Centre. 126 people attended these two events. A Formal consultation will take place around the legal processes of installing double yellow lines and other measures and installation of the resulting Highways measures should happen around April 2016. See NP Update for most recent enforcement measures undertaken.

One issue which the T&T sub-group discussed is the status of Bradwell Grove in Southmead: it is an unadopted road, owned by BCC Housing. It is affected by Southmead Hospital parking but could lose out on S106 mitigation work.

Recommendation: that the NP request BCC Housing and Highways to work together to get Bradwell Grove adopted as formal Highway.

- 3.7 Future meetings of the Traffic and Transport sub-group: The Traffic and Transport Sub-Group has agreed to hold its next meeting in partnership with the BS10 Parks & Planning Group as there is a strong shared agenda re: Sth Gloucestershire developments.
- 3.8 The T&T sub-group wants to work with BS10 Parks and Planning to develop a Public meeting catch-up about the emerging proposals for works in Bristol to manage the traffic/transport impacts of the Sth Glos development using Section 106 funding. This cannot take place, however, until South Gloucestershire and Bristol have completed more sophisticated computer modelling of predicted traffic flows and highways mitigation works. This is unlikely to be available before the New Year.
- 3.9 Henbury Loop: The Spur scheme has been adopted. The BCC Whole Council meeting has made a response (see Matters Arising from 22nd September NP minutes). A consultation on the location of the rail station starts at the end of November and runs until mid-January. The NP Co-ordinator will distribute information about this consultation. The choices are either the original, old station or a location behind Wolfridge Gardens in Brentry. Future proofing in order to permit expansion into a Loop system is being build in.

Item 6: Legal Information

When councillors decide how the wellbeing fund (or any other NP Budget) is spent they should have due regard to the Public Sector Equality Duty that applies to all public bodies. This duty is contained in the Equality Act 2010 and came in to force on 6 April 2011. It replaces previous equality duties under the Sex Discrimination, Race Relations and Disability Discrimination Acts.

The duty means that councillors are required to have due regard to the need to:

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation and other conduct prohibited under the Act
- Promote equality of opportunity between different groups
- · Foster good relations between people from different groups

The duty covers the following protected characteristics:

- Disability
- Sexual orientation
- Age
- Gender reassignment
- Religion and belief
- Sex
- Race
- Pregnancy and maternity

It also applies to marriage and civil partnership, but only in respect of the requirement to eliminate discrimination and harassment.
