1. Neighbourhood Forum update

The Forums have been very busy with as well as residents raising issues and meeting the service providers, we have had a number of presentations including Resource Futures about increasing recycling and Project ACE which is a Bath University pilot project around increasing support to isolated older people.

Engagement work outside of Forums has consisted of support to the Hengrove Health Group, visit to Maple Close lunch club, and sub group meetings.

We have also had the Stockwood Festival in July, and the weather did not dampen the event as it was moved to Christ the Servant on Stockwood Road – a Big Thanks to all those who helped with the day.

We had a community clean up early in April 2012, which cleared significant rubbish and a 'new' sign was found!

2. Clean and Green - non devolved £10K funding.

Work has been done by Payback at Petherton Road was paid from the non-devolved 10k Clean & Green.

3. Roll Out of 20 MPH Speed Limit

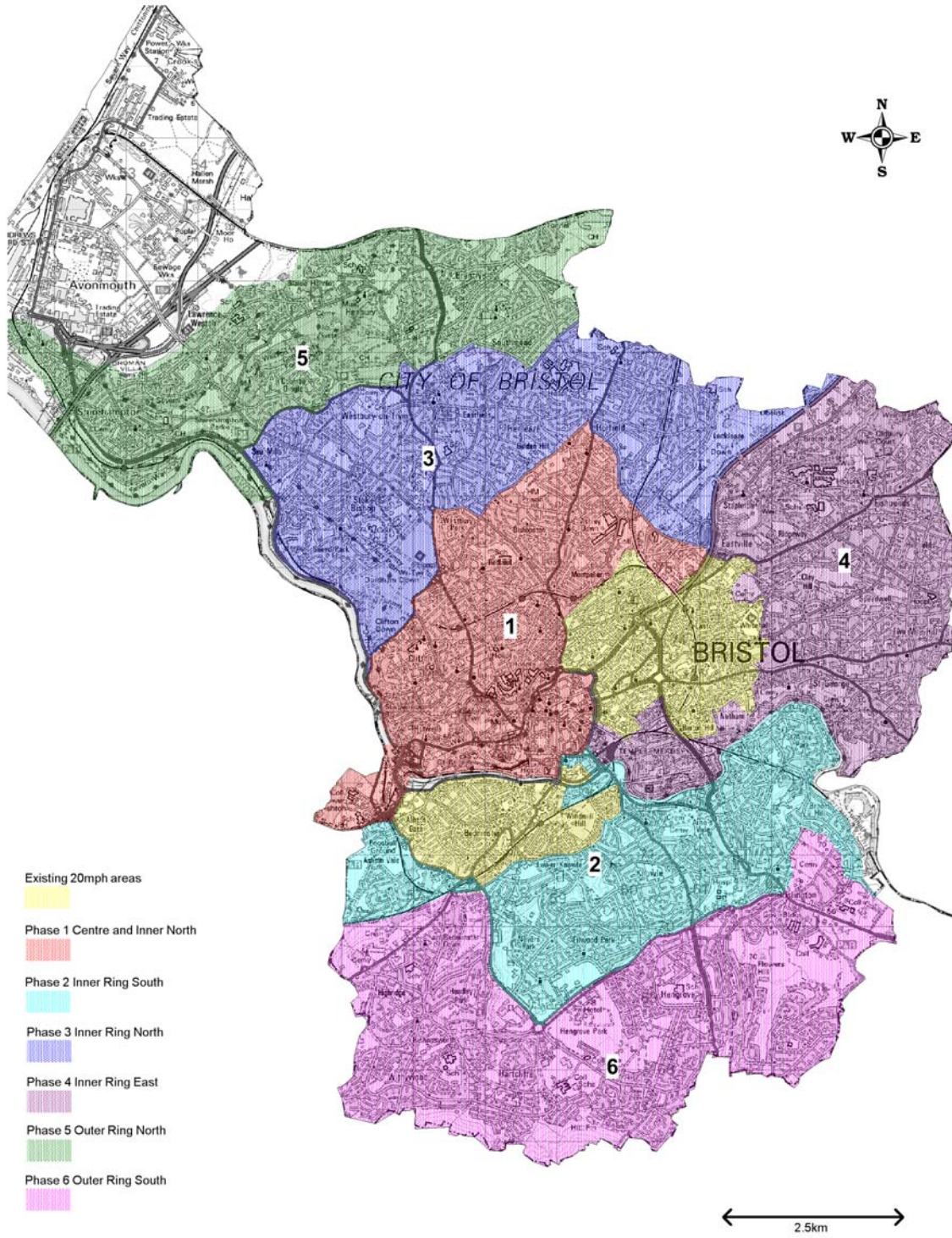
Bristol City Council has agreed to roll out 20 mph speed limits across the whole of Bristol. The roll out has been split into 6 phases, with this NP being in phase 6, meaning that consultation on the changes will start in the new year.

Neighbourhood Partnerships will have a role in recommending which roads should retain their 30 mph speed limits. Bristol City Council Highways Department will hold a series of local events to raise awareness of the upcoming changes during this time.

Highways will be running a series of engagement meetings/opportunities and exhibitions in each area as the 20mph project is rolled out. The purpose of these meetings is to:

- raise awareness of the 20 mph limit
- increase support
- ask people to discuss any roads they feel should not be included in the rollout and will want to know why they want to retain a 30 mph limit

4. Highways Infrastructure and Road Safety Grants

Hengrove and Stockwood NP submitted five applications to the Highways Infrastructure and Road Safety Grants as follows:

- Walsh Avenue
- Stockwood Lane
- Stockwood (Davids Rd, Longreach Grove) access
- Wells Road
- Hither Bath Bridge

All but one of the above applications met the criteria, but due to the fund being over subscribed and other assessment criteria by the highways team we have been successful in receiving funding for the Walsh Avenue application only, with Stockwood Lane on a reserve list if further funding become available.
