Title: Neighbourhood Partnership Waste Plan

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This report is from the Area Environment Officer. It is for information.

Neighbourhood Partnership members are asked to note the Waste and Environment Plan produced by the Environment Sub Group at their meeting held on 17th August 2012; see Appendix A.

Background

At the NP meeting of 20th June 2012, it was highlighted that Bristol's waste contractor May Gurney had agreed to work with Bristol City Council to develop Neighbourhood Waste Plans that address local waste and street scene issues.

The Waste Plan sets out how May Gurney and the Council will work with the NP, local residents and community-based organisations to ensure that service delivery is focussed on local priorities within the Partnership.

At a meeting held on 17th August 2012, the Hengrove and Stockwood Neighbourhood Partnership's Environment Sub Group produced the Waste Plan.

The meeting agreed the following three priorities would form the basis of the Hengrove and Stockwood Neighbourhood Partnership, Waste Plan:

- Fly tipping Identify and map out hot spot areas, reduce incidents of fly tipping in hot spot areas with letters to residents and businesses to assist in identifying culprits. Monitor and report actions taken and response times.
 - A number of hot spot areas have already been identified, in the Hengrove and Stockwood Wards. However, if other locations are identified they can be added to the list.
- 2. Campaign— to include both Educational and Enforcement elements. It was agreed that areas would be targeted to raise awareness of littering and dog waste issues, initially by speaking to people, it would be followed up in the same areas by enforcement at a later date. The aims will be to reduce complaints about littering and dog mess.
- **3. Satisfaction Survey-** To follow up waste and street scene enquiries by contacting a random selection of people who have made requests for service regarding waste, monitor and report response.

It was also agreed to run an environmental communications campaign focused on 'Managing Waste & Recycling More Effectively' across the NP area.

This campaign will be targeted at reducing street littering and fly tipping and improving recycling rates. Which should in turn achieve a reduction in complaints received through the Customer Service Centre.

- Localised messages delivered with the waste collection calendar.
- Positive articles on priority achievements by the Neighbourhood Partnership and the local May Gurney crews published on the Neighbourhood Partnership web site and at Neighbourhood Partnership Public Forums.
- Waste Doctors/ Community Stewards directed to tackle low recycling areas, in particular where recycling containers are constantly left on the street and fly tipping hotspots.
- Promotion of the Bulky Waste collections highlighting that residents on Job Seekers Allowance are entitled to two free collections per year. It is

hoped that this will reduce incidents of fly tipping and improve the local street environment.
