Reducing theft of vehicle registration plates

To respond to small rises in the levels of car registration plates being stolen, officers from the Neighbourhood Police Teams, the Safer Homes (formerly the 'Bobby Van' scheme) team and Safer Bristol carried out some events at local supermarkets.

Customers were offered free 'tamper-proof number plate screws' to be installed on their vehicles whilst they waited (or shopped). This took place at Asda, Oatlands Avenue Hengrove and Tesco extra, Callington Road which was of direct benefit to esidents of Hengove, Stockwood and other parts of South Bristol. In total over 120 vehicles were secured. Residents were also registered on 'Immobilse' to catalogue and protect their belongings, and signed up to the Police mailing list.

Community confidence

Last year a pilot project was carried out in the Brislington East & West wards to disseminate positive messages about crime and disorder levels in the area, in a bid to increase confidence among the community. Last year Brislington East & West showed up as 'cold spots' where perceptions of crime did not match reality, this year Stockwood is indicated as an area with reduced community confidence.

It is difficult to conclusively judge how successful these measures were in 2012 as we are reliant purely on the results of the 2012 Quality of Life survey, however but we are planning a similar exercise this year. The plan is to disseminate specific messages in leaflet form as well as through email and word of mouth.

Dutton Road & Sturminster Road - ASB

ASB has been reported (as well as drug dealing) from addresses in these two streets.

- The ASB multi-agency meeting has been taking action against a number of properties and individuals, and support for vulnerable residents.
- There have been frequent patrols from the beat team over a sustained period
- Residents have received many reminders of how to report issues to the Police and Council.

 Outreach youth work and 'street games' have taken place on the Whittock Road open space to positively engage with the young people that use the space.

The levels of ASB and drug activity have continued to reduce and the number of problem tenancies have reduced as well. This area continues to be monitored by the Anti-social behaviour multi-agency meeting on a monthly basis.

Street reps

Street reps is a scheme where local residents sign up to be eyes and ears for waste, streetscene, environmental and highways related issues for their street and any surrounding streets they regularly use. They are given all the information needed to report including a user guide, quick reference guide and monitoring forms. This project is continuing to be used in Hengrove and Stockwood, and there have been steady trickle of residents signing up in the last year.

3. Community Priorities for last 6 months

Hengrove

May

- ASB Glasscutter Apartments Car Park young people gathering under porch in early evenings and weekends, noise, litter and suspected cannabis use.
- ASB Whitchurch Green bottles being thrown over back yards, damage to saplings and fencing, vehicles blocking rear lanes and suspected cannabis use.
- ASB Church Lane young persons congregating in bushes, noise and littering.

August

- ASB Tarnock Ave/Clatworthy/Fanshawe Nuisance motorbikes
- ASB Whitchurch Green bottles being thrown over back yards, damage to saplings and fencing, vehicles blocking rear lanes and suspected cannabis
- ASB Griggfield Walk Youths late at night out in the street causing ASB.

August

Targeted patrols have been completed in relation to all the above listed priorities. This has led to an increase of knowledge of who is responsible for the ASB and necessary interventions being made.
