1. Current budget situation

The Well Being Panel met on Tuesday 6th November. The AC wasn't present. Its recommendations are set out in table 1 below. This was the third panel meeting of 2012/13.

Total Well Being at start of this year: <u> \pounds 36, 150.85</u>. This figure comprises the \pounds 30k for 2012/13 and \pounds 6,150.85 carried forward as unspent from \pounds 2011/12

The current balance in the HSBWOT Well Being Fund is £31,634.53. If the NP agrees the recommendations set out below, this will leave $\underline{$ £28,200.55} for the remainder of the year.

The difficulty experienced in paying the **£660** approved at the June meeting to the residents of Lawrence Grove has been resolved. The BCC Tree Team refunded the money to the residents. A subsequent transfer from the BCR Well Being budget to the Tree Team was made.

I would like to express my concern that the NP is heading for a significant underspend on this year's Well Being budget. The NP is again reminded that it has the capacity to spend the Well Being Fund on projects of its own choosing and not just on small grants. As a matter of urgency, please will the NP consider possible projects to ensure that a significant majority of its funds are spent or committed by the end of March 2013?

3. Legal Information

When councillors decide how the wellbeing fund is spent they should have due regard to the public sector equality duty that applies to all public bodies. This duty is contained in the Equality Act 2010 and came in to force on 6 April 2011. It replaces previous equality duties under the Sex Discrimination, Race Relations and Disability Discrimination Acts.

The duty means that councillors are required to have due regard to the need to :

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation and other conduct prohibited under the Act
- Promote equality of opportunity between different groups
- Foster good relations between people from different groups

The duty covers the following protected characteristics:

- Disability
- Sexual orientation
- Age
- Gender reassignment
- Religion and belief
- Sex
- Race
- Pregnancy and maternity

It also applies to marriage and civil partnership, but only in respect of the requirement to eliminate discrimination and harassment.
