1. Well Being Panel recommendations

The Well Being Panel met on Wednesday 8th May. Its recommendations are set out in table 1 below. This was the first panel meeting of 2013/14

For a detailed breakdown of the NP's Well Being expenditure in 2012/13 please see the attached Annual Business Report. I would like to give my annual thanks to Gay Huggins who always provides such accurate figures for the Well Being expenditure. Gay always makes the work of the Area Coordinator considerably easier than it would otherwise be.

Total Well Being available at the start of 2012/13 was <u>£36,150.85</u>. This figure comprised the <u>£30k</u> for 2012/13 and <u>£6,150.85</u> carried forward as unspent from £2011/12.

The NP has provided grants of $\underline{\pounds 27,940.10}$ in 2012/13. This leaves a carry forward of $\underline{\pounds 8,324.75}$ in to the current year. This is added to the annual $\underline{\pounds 30,000}$ Well Being pot, giving the NP a total <u>of £38,324.75</u> to allocate this financial year. The grants recommended in table 1 total $\underline{\pounds 5,089.50}$

Legal Information

When councillors decide how the wellbeing fund is spent they should have due regard to the public sector equality duty that applies to all public bodies. This duty is contained in the Equality Act 2010 and came in to force on 6 April 2011. It replaces previous equality duties under the Sex Discrimination, Race Relations and Disability Discrimination Acts.

The duty means that councillors are required to have due regard to the need to :

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation and other conduct prohibited under the Act
- Promote equality of opportunity between different groups
- Foster good relations between people from different groups

The duty covers the following protected characteristics:

- Disability
- Sexual orientation
- Age
- Gender reassignment
- Religion and belief
- Sex
- Race
- Pregnancy and maternity

It also applies to marriage and civil partnership, but only in respect of the requirement to eliminate discrimination and harassment.
