Title:Well Being Report

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RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Well Being Funding 2014/15

Well Being funding at the start of the year was $\underline{\text{£30,000}}$ for this NP. The NP awarded $\underline{\text{£10,087}}$ at the June meeting. This leaves $\underline{\text{£19,913}}$ to allocate during the remainder of this financial year.

2. Well Being Panel recommendations

The Well Being Panel met on Tuesday 2^{nd} September. Its recommendations are set out in table 1 below. If the recommended allocations are agreed by the NP, the total amount allocated this NP is <u>£3,825</u>. This will leave <u>£16,088</u> to allocate during the remainder of this financial year.

4. Other grant funds

At its meeting, the panel discussed the possibility of recommending that certain applications might be more appropriately funded by the Green Capital Fund, also held by this NP. Where this occurs, the agreed process for dealing with Green Capital applications will be followed.

The panel also **agreed** to retain the £3,000 awarded to the 43^{rd} Bristol Scouts for new toilet and kitchen facilities at the June 2014 NP meeting and to carry it forward until the group is ready to receive it. This follows a request by the group that due to the urgent need to rebuild the scout hut, there would be little point in updating the toilets and kitchen if the building, overall, is in too poor a state to continue to be used. The group is actively fundraising and planning for a new building. The £3,000 award will feature as 'funds raised' in the group's new build plans.

Legal Information

When councillors decide how the wellbeing fund is spent they should have due regard to the public sector equality duty that applies to all public bodies. This duty is contained in the Equality Act 2010 and came in to force on 6 April 2011. It replaces previous equality duties under the Sex Discrimination, Race Relations and Disability Discrimination Acts.

The duty means that councillors are required to have due regard to the need to :

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation and other conduct prohibited under the Act
- Promote equality of opportunity between different groups
- Foster good relations between people from different groups

The duty covers the following protected characteristics:

- Disability
- Sexual orientation
- Age
- Gender reassignment
- Religion and belief
- Sex
- Race
- Pregnancy and maternity

It also applies to marriage and civil partnership, but only in respect of the requirement to eliminate discrimination and harassment.
