**1. Back Ground**

- 1.1 As outlined in previous reports Henleaze, Stoke Bishop and Westbury on Trym Neighbourhood Partnership has formally agreed 6 key local priorities for the Neighbourhood Working team to work on, below is the updated on those priorities that have progressed this quarter

**2. Updated priority action plan –**

**2.1 Canford Park Toilets** – these have been ordered and will be installed before the Summer Holidays.

**2.2 Dog fouling**

The team have been working hard to address the dog fouling issues in the area. All homes on Springfield Grove were visited with posters and information re dog fouling and how to report it.

We have also been leading a programme of activities in the Home Ground area – this includes visiting over 130 homes to educate people with posters as above, we have put up posters, spoken to over 20 residents and have had leads to potential perpetrators. These have

been visited and spoken to. The situation is being monitored, and so far it looks like the campaign has been successful.

### 2.3 Litter

We are currently looking into a problem at **Junction of Stoke Hill, Druid Hill and Old Sneed Avenue BS9.**

A property on Old Sneed Avenue has been visited and spoken to about their recycling arrangements, nets have been purchased and this situation should now be rectified.

We have visited the shops and takeaways and reminded them of their responsibilities and asked them to remind customers not to litter.

After speaking with the Waste Team, the street cleaning has been done to the standard in the contract, May Gurney works to a set standard that's governed by the EPA act, this act has a set of different standards ranging from A1 to E. I think we expect that all our streets verges to be B plus, these verges in your photos sent in are well within that standard.

### 3. Other information

The service is currently undergoing a restructure and the Neighbourhood Working service will now be part of the Neighbourhood Management service, we will have 3.5 Neighbourhood Officer posts operating in the North Area (Avonmouth & Kingsweston, Horfield and Lockleaze, Southmead, Henbury and Brentry, Henleaze, Stoke Bishop and WoT and Bishopston Cotham and Redland).
