Title: Neighbourhood Partnership Plan Update

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Activity/Description	Update	
	Priority: The Neighbourhood Partnership has good quality parks	
Improve Gainsborough Square	 Landscape works to the central greenspace: The goals have been installed, and after the school holidays, the uneven grass games area will be re-graded and new grass laid in the Autumn. When this work takes place, the games area will be fenced off so the grass can get established. The raised bed in the garden area on the corner has been built and it was planted during the Love Lockleaze festival. The seats and litter bins have been installed, and there will be some additional seats installed inside the play area. Planters will be installed along the paved road frontage area near the shops, and planted with seasonal bedding and herbs. The meadow areas have been flowering during the Summer and are being weeded and new seed will be sown so they flower again next year. The canopy pavilion: The foundations for the pavilion have been constructed and the frame and deck surface has been built. The decked area has an electric point installed as part of the canopy, for use during community events. The covering frame and seats will be installed in the Autumn 	
Improve Stoke Park	Estates are currently deciding who will write the Stoke Park Conservation Management Plan. They applied for an English Heritage grant to fund 80% of the costs of writing it, this will be announced in the first week in September The CMP is planned to be produced by 31 January 2016 subject to outcome of tenders and grant application to Historic England. Estates are looking at purchasing further entitlements, which are subsidies for the agricultural business (haycut) to provide income for Stoke Park.
