1.0 Environment Group

- 1.1 This group met on 12th October 2015.
- 1.2 **Little Green Grants** Invitations to apply for the remainder of the Green Capital money (£715 for Horfield and £4,000 from Lockleaze) were publicised to the Neighbourhood Partnership mailing list. Ten applications were received and applicants were given the opportunity of presenting their project to the meeting. Meeting attendees were asked to place two votes in support any two projects. The group then reviewed the votes and allocated the money as follows:

Lockleaze

- South Lockleaze and Purdown Neighbourhood Group Outdoor education programme £800
- Groundwork Local growing programme to teach young people and children about growing and local food £1000
- Filton Ave Nursery School creating an oasis of clam for families to appreciate nature £925
- United Communities and LPW 'Let's love Rubbish in Lockleaze' £650
- Horfield Community Association Environmentally based workshops for children and young people focusing on tool use, woodwork, fire use and healthy eating £625

Horfield

- Pride of Place Residents' Group Re-use leaflet, re-cycling blitz and nature appreciation in Horfield only £400
- Horfield and Lockleaze Neighbourhood Partnership Environment Group re-positioning of park benches and litter bin on Horfield common £315
- 1.3 The group received an update on the "Flagged Up" Green Capital Art project by the artist Deborah Weinreb. This is now installed and the group agreed it was a success.
- 1.4 The group recommend that the Neighbourhood Partnership approve £3600 to pay for a disabled swing for Monks Park Children's Play Area. This has come from as a direct request from a resident with a disabled child. This will come from s106 07/01523 / Prefab Site, Dorian Road, Horfield / ZCD...914 for "the provision of improvements to Parks and Open Spaces within one mile of the former Dorian Road Prefab Site" (Total value of this s106 £24,001.55)
- 1.5 The group agreed that the Neighbourhood Officer will use £415 from the Clean and Green budget to re-position a litter bin and benches on Horfield Common, to match fund the £300 from the Little Green Grants.
- 1.6 Total Parks s106 available is £214,728.47
- 1.7 At the September meeting the Tree Forum asked the Neighbourhood Partnership to designate a Tree Champion for this Neighbourhood Partnership. They also requested that this Neighbourhood Partnership write to Highways and ask them to put in tree pits in new schemes wherever possible.

2.0 Traffic & Transport Group

- 2.1 This Group met on the 22nd October 2015.
- 2.2 Local Traffic Schemes the Beaufort Road scheme will be delivered if the Sainsbury's development goes ahead, otherwise it will be considered against the other priorities of this group. The Church Road, Romney Avenue and Wellington Hill West schemes are in progress and advice has been sought from management about how to deliver the Church Road scheme as this will be in Bishopston ward following the boundary change in March 2016.
- 2.3 The group were disappointed that the consultations for the Southmead zebra crossing happened mostly during school holidays.
- 2.4 Several new issues were discussed and have been added to the Traffic Choices Tracker https://tracker.trafficchoices.co.uk/partnership/list including parking on the pavement on Bishopthrope Road. These will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting.
- 2.5 Buses issues with existing services and improvements in the bus services will be addressed at a separate meeting with First, Wessex and BCC to discuss solutions. The group have requested information about when Romney Avenue bus link will be open.
- 2.6 The group recommend developing a Cycling Plan and the Neighbourhood Partnership is asked to approve this recommendation and add this to the Neighbourhood Partnership Plan.
- 2.7 The group raised a number of issues with the Southmead Hospital Parking Review which were fed back to officers.
- 2.8 Total Transport s106 available is £205,571.64

3.0 Employment and Economy

- 3.1 This group met on the 13th October 2015.
- 3.2 The group discussed the possible closure of B&Q and the opening of the Lidl store and the impact of these on jobs for local people. Concern was raised that the Lidl would jeapardise the possibility of a supermarket on Gainsborough Square.
- 3.3 A working group will look at the transition from long term benefits to work and produce a report with actions for the next E&E meeting and take the recommendations to the March Neighbourhood Partnership.

4.0 Grants Panel

- 4.1 The Panel met on the 11th November 2015. Tamsin Evans stepped down from Chair prior to the meeting and the Panel agreed Fiona Deas as the new Chair.
- 4.2 The Young People's project from United Communities was underspent by £300, because the basketball kit was donated and did not have to be purchased. United Communities have requested that this funding contributes to a trip to Bath Spa for the girls and a trip to a skateboard park for the boys who attended the summer projects and are identified to be vulnerable. The Panel requests that the Neighbourhood Committee approves this change in funding.
- 4.3 The 2014 Stoke Park Walks, Talks and Photography project delivered 9 out of the 10 walks applied for, incurred additional unexpected administration costs due to the secretary leaving and was not able to deliver the photography competition. Consequently, this project was underspent by £250. This has been returned. The Neighbourhood Committee is asked to acknowledge and accept these changes to the project.
- 4.4 The Panel discussed the two Stoke Park applications and agreed to stand by their previous decision (approved by the Neighbourhood Partnership) that projects for Stoke Park will not be considered for Wellbeing funding until the Dowry fund has been spent. However, it was anticipated that the Neighbourhood Committee may want to overturn this decision as this was not made clear in the Wellbeing application or guidance notes (this has now been corrected). If this is the case then the Sculpture Trail scored sufficient to be funding, while the St Werburgh's City Farm application was well below, so the Panel would recommend that the St Werburgh's City Farm project is not reconsidered for funding.
- 4.5 Seven applications were received and the Panel's recommendations on each are shown below. The Neighbourhood Committee is asked to approve these recommendations:

4.6 The Wellbeing Panel would like to hold an event instead of their next meeting to bring together and celebrate all the Wellbeing and Green Capital projects over the last year and request that the Neighbourhood Partnership allocate a budget of up to £500 to support this (room hire, food etc). The Neighbourhood Committee is asked to approve this request. This would leave a budget of £860 that could be carried over to 2016-17.

5.0 Neighbourhood Budget

- 5.1 The total devolved provisional Neighbourhood Budget for 2015/16 is £46,441.00 (this budget will be confirmed once the Highways carry-over figures are received). This is in addition to CIL and Section 106 funds.

6.1 Horfield Forum

The Forum was held on the 2nd November, ? residents attended. The Forum heard:

- Police priorities in the last quarter had been road safety. Police have been asked to focus on this again, with a particular interest in cycling safely.
- o John Knowlson (BCC Youth and Play officer) will be looking into alternative provision to deal with anti-social behaviour at the MUGA on Maskelyne Avenue, LPW are also extending their outreach in this area to help deal with the issue.
- LPW presented information about their ongoing work with young people including engagement work at events, and outreach at Maskelyne Avenue and the Leisure Centre.
- Nigel Lapworth came along to discuss the Southmead Hospital Parking Review, around 30 residents had attended the
 first event and 100 at the next. Comments were received at these events and online forms are being completed. Cllr
 Hiscott will be raising the slow progress of this project with the Mayor next week. This consultation is now closed.
- Lockleaze Community Orchard continue to meet regularly and are hoping to plant more trees and enhance the site further.

6.2 Lockleaze Forum

The Forum was held on the 4th November, 7 residents attended. The Forum heard:

- Police priorities in the last quarter were on drugs (2 successful raids had been carried out), late night noise from the Golden Bottle, the spooky week activities seemed to have had an impact as the number of calls over Halloween reduced, motorbike issues had decreased but distraction burglaries have increased.
- LPW and United Communities presented information about their ongoing work with young people including engagement work at events, The Vench and outreach at Emerson Square.
- o Saliha Ahmed has just started worked at Lockleaze Neighbourhood Trust focussing on children, young and older people
- o Concerns about the 24/25 bus service were raised.
- o there is an on-line site that community groups with any interest in using the Eastville Library building, can get more information and register their groups' interest and say how this will benefit the community. www.bristol.gov.uk/elb

7.0 City wide Neighbourhood Partnership event on 24th October 2015

Over 80 people took place in the 2nd Citywide Np Conference, energetic discussions took place covering many subjects, such as StreetScene, community plans, communications, the Community Charter, and a very lively debate led by young people with the general consensus that Neighbourhood Partnerships would welcome further participation by young people.

A full report will be written once the evaluation surveys have been returned and the working group have met mid-December.

Several people attended training on how to speak on the radio and spoke on live radio at the event. Each Neighbourhood Partnership will have a chance to take part in a breakfast show between now and Xmas and we have contacted all those who did the training to set this up. Those Neighbourhood Partnerships which did not have anyone on the training have also been offered a slot via their Neighbourhood Partnership Coordinator.

8.0 Voluntary and Community Sector Grants

Consulting on a proposed new approach to grant funding

The Council currently invests over £18m in the voluntary and community sector (VCS) each year through grants, rate relief and reduced rents and leases on council-owned buildings.

People from the council and the VCS have agreed that we need to focus the council's grant investment on tackling disadvantage in the city and we believe that by having a clear focus and by working better together, we can use this money more strategically and have a far bigger impact. We have worked together to design a new approach to grant funding. This will align up to £5m of revenue grant funding to make it work better for the people who need it most.

We are consulting on the proposed new approach from 16th November until 15th February. Our consultation will be with local voluntary and community sector organisations and other interested parties. 9.0 West of England Joint Spatial Plan and Joint Transport Study

The four local authorities in the West of England are seeking the views of local communities in drawing up a plan to steer new housing and jobs growth over the next 20 years. The Joint Spatial Plan being prepared by Bath and North East Somerset, Bristol City, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire Councils will identify:

- the amount and broad locations of new homes and employment land to be planned for up to 2036;
- the transport and other essential infrastructure that will be required to support housing and jobs growth.

To begin the process of involvement the Councils are consulting on the Joint Spatial Plan Issues and Options document.

To inform the Joint Spatial Plan and future transport strategies for the area, the Councils are also preparing a Joint Transport Study. This will identify the key transport issues affecting the West of England over the next 20 years and the transport solutions needed to address them. Comments are being sought on the Councils' initial ideas.

The closing date for comments on this stage of consultation is 29 January 2016. There is information on the consultations at www.jointplanningwofe.org.uk and copies of documents will be available in local libraries. An event for Bristol's Neighbourhood Partnerships to find out more and discuss the consultations is being planned.
