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ELENA History

- Cross-party support for ELENA including setting up the municipal energy company, Cabinet report September 2010
- > EIB contract signed, March 2012
- Appointment of 5 initial staff to develop and deliver investment programme, January 2013
- Appointment of Service Director Energy, April 2013
- Restructuring, no recruitment possible, October/November 2013 – June/July 2014
- Completion of restructuring, July 2014
- > Further recruitment of 6 more staff, August October 2014
- Full delivery of all programme strands including procurement of contracts, October 2014 June 2016

ELENA Funding

- ELENA technical assistance grant of £2.5m to provide additional staff resources and funding for preparing the programme
- £62.5m of investment into energy efficiency and renewable energy projects by the 1st June 2016
- > 4 strands of work + set up of municipal energy company
 - Energy Saving measures on social and private housing properties
 - > energy efficiency measures on public buildings
 - solar PV installations on social housing and public sector buildings
 - district heating networks

- Obtained Cabinet approval on 6th July 2015 to set up a fully licenced energy company, wholly owned by Bristol City Council
- Controlled Market Entry completed by the end of the year
- Energy Supply and Service

Energy Efficiency - Salix

Utilising Salix Recycling Fund (£1.2m with up to 5 year paybacks)

- £1m per year in savings, £4m since fund began
- > Fund size to be increased as project pipeline is >£2m
- > Audit of all BCC buildings to improve procurement routes
- → Joint ventures with Solar PV → Schools Programme
- Iconic Bristol buildings
 - City Hall and M Shed underway
 - Colston Hall, City Museum, Central Library to follow

Completed:

- > 900kW solar PV installed
- EU compliant Solar PV procurement framework
 - □ Up to £47m works
 - Corporate buildings and social housing









BCC Renewable Energy – In Progress

- Eight packages of corporate buildings planned under EU Framework
 - □ ~ 1.5MW / £1.8m through 2015
 - Package of three leisure centres completed.
 - M-Shed currently in construction
- Work with other public sector organisations such as the Cabinet Office/the NHS to do work on their buildings

- > Installation summer 2015






District Heating work stream

PROGRESS


- Total of £39m of leverage factor delivered by the end of September with another £12m in the pipeline
