Report of the Director of Neighbourhoods

Purpose of Report

1. To determine an application for the grant of a street trading consent at the following location: Outside Lidl, Fishponds Road, Bristol

Background

- 2. With effect from 1 May 2009 the above location has been designated as a consent street for the purpose of Schedule 4 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982. Any street trading at that location other than under a street trading consent issued by the Council would constitute a criminal offence.
- 3. General conditions which would be attached to a consent if granted are at Appendix A
- 4. On 21 June 2012 Mr Sakir Yildirim applied for a street trading consent which, if granted, would enable the applicant to trade lawfully at the above location. The applicant has applied to sell the following goods

Hot Food :

During the hours of	1800 – 0330 Monday to Saturday
	1800 – 0300 Sunday

- 5. The application form is attached at Appendix B. Photographs of the unit are attached at Appendix C and a site location plan at Appendix D.
- 6. Consultation

- 8. Of these responses one, from Cllr Stevenson, was received outside the consultation period.
- 9. Schedule 4 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 deals with street trading consents. Subject to certain exemptions that do not apply to this application, Paragraph 7 enables the Council to grant a consent if they think fit. The Council may attach such conditions as they consider necessary, which may include among other things conditions to prevent obstruction of the street or danger to persons using it, nuisance or annoyance etc. A consent may include permission for its holder to trade in a consent street from a stationery van, car, barrow or other vehicle, or from a portable stall. Unless such permission is included the Act prohibits a consent holder trading from a van or other vehicle or from a stall, barrow or cart.

If such a permission is included then the Council may include conditions

(a) as to where the holder of the street trading consent may trade by virtue of the permission; and

(b) as to the times between which or periods for which he may so trade.

A street trading consent may be granted for any period not exceeding 12 months but may be revoked at any time. The holder of a street trading consent may at any time surrender his consent to the Council and it shall then cease to be valid.

10. Mr Yildirim has been provided with a copy of the report and has been invited to the meeting.

# GENERAL CONDITIONS THAT WILL NORMALLY BE ATTACHED TO STREET TRADING CONSENTS


The consent holder shall only trade on the days and between the times stated on the consent.

- 1. The consent holder shall only trade in the description of articles stated on the consent.
- 3. The consent holder shall not carry on business on any street so as to cause obstruction or cause danger to people using the street.
- 4. The consent holder shall not carry on business from any vehicle or erect or place any stall or other structure in any street except in the area mentioned in the consent.
- 5. The consent holder shall not sell, offer or expose for sale any goods or articles other than those described within the principle terms of this consent.
- 6. The consent holder shall on all occasions, when carrying on business, be strictly sober, and conduct him/herself in a proper, civil and courteous manner, and he/she shall not carry on his/her business in such a way as to cause annoyance to the occupier or person in charge of any shop, business, resident, or any person using the street.
- 7. The consent holder shall at all times conduct his/her business and position any vehicle used by him/her in connection with his/her business in such a manner that no danger is likely to arise to persons trading or intending to trade.
- 8. The consent holder shall at all times conduct his/her business in a clean and tidy manner.
- 9. The consent holder shall ensure that a copy of the consent is clearly visible to the public.

- 10. The consent holder shall not permit any person to assist him/her in his/her trading unless the details of that person have been supplied to the Licensing Authority. Any such person shall be issued with an identification badge by the Licensing Authority.
- 11. If, during the currency of any consent any material change occurs in the facts of which particulars and information were contained in, or given along with, the application for the consent, the holder of the consent shall report such changes to the Licensing Authority within 72 hours of that change.
- 12. Any motor vehicle used for the purpose of street trading shall at all times be in a roadworthy condition and have the relevant documents i.e insurance, tax and MOT to make the use of that vehicle on a road legal. These documents will be produced by the consent holder to any police officer or authorised officer of the Council.
- 13. Neither the consent holder nor any assistant shall display merchandise which is likely to cause offence or distress to any other person or which would be deemed an offence under any other legislation.
- 14. A consent holder selling food shall at all times comply with any food hygiene regulations in force at that time, and when required by the Licensing Authority, shall produce appropriate food handling certificates.
- 15. The city Council reserves the right to alter or amend these conditions at any time.
- 16. The subletting of any consent is prohibited.
- 17. The consent holder shall be responsible for the temporary storage of refuse, liquid and other material accumulated or created whilst trading and its subsequent removal from the site. The removal and disposal must be to the satisfaction of the Council.
- 18. The consent holder shall not cause any nuisance or annoyance to persons using the street.

19. The consent holder, if intending to sell food from a stationery vehicle/stall shall operate from a purpose made vehicle/stall constructed and managed so as to comply with the relevant hygiene regulations currently in force within the provisions of the Food Safety Act 1990, and any subsequent changes to those regulations.








# Kebab Master Straite Ferade - High Street, Fishponds



We have to advise you that we are experiencing many concerned Fishponds residents who object to the above application.

1- The site is within an already fully served convenience/fast food area and the closure time of 3am/3.30am would be detrimental to the residents and fabric of life in the area.

2- Considering also that the present residents in Hinton Road have contended with people being sick, bringing up the food they bought between the hours of 11pm and 1pm after a night of drinking in the several public houses in the area.

3- Also considering the area is a no drinking zone at 3am/3.30am will retain many people who are under the influence of alcohol and will bring the need for Police presence at a time of day when people need their sleep for work next day.

4- The addition of another takeaway food outlet will add to the already overloaded rubbish accumulation in surrounding roads.

On file Bristol City Council has ours and residents complaints that Hinton Road, Guinea Lane and New Station Road are littered with food and rubbish left by people eating in the streets of Fishponds.

4- Businesses already trading in the area would have their trade seriously curtailed and Fishponds has seen businesses close in recent months and any additional pressure on existing business will see Rate paying businesses reduce. We feel revenue for the Council would be reduced should this application go through because existing property based fast food traders will close.



I've consulted with colleagues on this and we have concerns from a Highway point of view are that there is insufficient parking for customers. Anyone parking on double yellow lines could get a parking ticket. However there should be no other objections to the principle of the van trading within the marked parking area.

With regards to the application he I proposing to trade from 6.00pm Mon – Fri whereas the bus lane is operational until 6.30pm. My advice is that trading cant be allowed to take place during the hours that the bus lane and parking restrictions are operational. I've attached photos of traffic signs showing the parking restrictions for information.

I don't know how busy this trader is likely to be so don't know if parking will be a problem within the layby.

I wish to object to the application. The objections I gave for a previous application for this applicant to have a van on Straits Parade still apply.

The new application is for a van to be situated in the bus lane during hours when it is non operational and its removal at 3.30am will cause extra noise. There are residents living in very near proximity to this site and the noise, antisocial behaviour and litter previously associated with this van are now proposed to be transferred to this residential area which already suffers badly with problems from a nearby public house - The Portcullis.

The customers of this Kebab van are likely to include the customers of the Portcullis who already commit a lot of antisocial behaviour in Elmdale Close which is situated immediately opposite the proposed site. Residents tell me that drunks defacate and urinate in their small car park, fights are regular and make a lot of noise in the early hours, drunks ring on door bells and then run away and even have sex there. The list of antisocial behaviour is endless. These residents are elderly( in some cases over 90 years of age) and already need help and they must not have this further problem foisted upon them causing sleepless nights and anxiety in the middle of the night.

Please refuse this application.
