#### **Covid 19 Summer Plan**

- Guidance rather than law informed decision and dynamic risk assessment
- Reinforce Vaccination uptake and booster programme
- Proportionate Test, Trace and enable change of approach to contacts under 18 and double vaccinated persons will not routinely need to isolate
- Manage borders and support global response
- Retain contingency plans in event of unexpected circumstances

Context: Cases, hospitalisation & deaths rising and expected to continue to rise. Anticipate challenging winter with Covid +


#### **Bristol Headlines – Covid 19**

- Delta variant dominant, highly transmissible



# Trends in geographical spread




97% of areas in Bristol now have at least one case (only 14% on 2<sup>nd</sup> May)




Bristol rank = 21st out 149 English local authorities (1st = highest rate in England, 149th = lowest rate)
