The following petitions have been notified:

Petition CP 01 – Cllr Hartley to present petition

Petition title: Keep Baltic Wharf in the Harbourside : Halt all plans

Petition wording: Severe and fatal flooding threatens the Harbourside, says the Environment Agency. And the Council just passed a cross-party motion to protect all green spaces from destructive development, so:

1. We ask the Council to restore Baltic Wharf to the promised 2-year public consultation on the whole of the Western Harbour Project. Developing any part of the Western Harbourside affects the whole and set a dangerous precedent and undermine the outcome of democratic consultation.

2. We ask the Council to uphold that Baltic Wharf is certainly a greenfield site. We petition elected councillors of all parties to reject attempts to unjustifiably and suddenly label the Baltic Wharf caravan site as “brownfield.” With its 101 mature and healthy trees, 124m thick hedgerows and a canopy cover of nearly 40%, this is not the National Planning Policy Framework definition of brownfield, nor the dictionary's. As a crucial ecological haven, a vital protector from flooding and extreme urban heating, and the only substantial tree-covered space on the Harbourside, Baltic Wharf is a much needed and beautiful example of green spaces protected by the recent cross-party motion.
