

£94.7m funding for first phase infrastructure, including three new station entrances, granted by DLUHC in June 2022.

Development Framework setting out the long-term vision to regenerate the area was endorsed following public consultation by BCC Cabinet on 2 May 2023.

















Strategic Priorities

- Phase 1 and 2 masterplan masterplanner appointed by end-September
- Placemaking commission to finesse and refine the TQ vision late 2023
- Working to establish a Joint Delivery Vehicle anticipated by end 2023
- Land pooling and land assembly agreements ongoing
- Procurement of Development Partner through 2024, appointment 2025
- Employment and Skills strategy and Social Value strategy development
- Ongoing community and stakeholder engagement
- Joined-up working across developments, including developer forum to coordinate communications and construction logistics











JDV remit

- Formalise the long-standing collaborative working arrangements that are already in place under the Memorandum of Understanding between the council and its Temple Quarter public sector delivery partners Homes England, West of England Combined Authority and Network Rail (JDV Partners)
- Project managing the delivery of the Phase 1 Infrastructure items in line with GFA and Collaboration Agreement;
- Procurement of the development partner for Phase 1 in line with the JDV Business Plan
- All land property negotiations in Temple Quarter
- Temple Quarter Masterplan and Strategic Outline Business Case for Phase 2
- Developing and implementing the social value and employment and skills strategy that provides tangible benefits to Bristol and the region;
- Business Plan grounded in the council's Corporate Plan and the Temple Quarter Development Framework endorsed by BCC's Cabinet in May this year













November Cabinet Recommendations

- It is the intention of the Joint Delivery Team to take a series of recommendations to Bristol City Council's Cabinet in November 2023. It is anticipated these recommendations will include approvals to
 - Enter into the JDV
 - Make Phase 1 land available to the JDV
 - Enable the JDV to commence a procurement process to procure a developer partner for Phase 1.
