Statement to Growth and Regeneration scrutiny

Unfortunately I did not receive a proper answer from the cabinet member with responsibility for housing to my question at Full Council. Details are here:

Question 1. The 2022/23 housing completion figures should have been submitted by Bristol City Council to the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) by Friday 14 July 2023. As it is now September, please can you tell me the total number of new homes completed in 2022/23, of which how many are classed as affordable, and how many of those are for social rent?

REPLY

• Our return was submitted, and all this detail will be published in due course.

It is not clear to me why the total number of houses completed in 2022/23 cannot be released since the figure is known, and the number of 'affordable' homes (309) has been released.

I am too late to ask a question at Growth & Regeneration Scrutiny, but I would be extremely grateful if members of the commission were able discuss the total number of houses completed in 2022/23.
