Proposal for bike parking enhancement at Kingsway Parade utilising section 106 funds

As a concerned and proactive resident of the vicinity of Nags Head Hill, St. George, I wish to propose the utilisation of Section 106 funds from the development project (*Planning reference: 06/05045*) at 77 and 97 Nags Head Hill, for the establishment of robust bike parking facilities at Kingsway Parade.

Kingsway Parade, being a publicly owned open space, presents an excellent opportunity for enhancing bike parking which in turn encourages cycling, reduces traffic congestion, and contributes to a healthier, more sustainable community. The specified funds aimed at improving parks and open spaces within a mile radius of the mentioned development project can significantly contribute towards this initiative, aligning with the broader goals of promoting eco-friendly transportation solutions in our area.

This proposal underscores the community's need for better cycling infrastructure while making efficient use of available resources to create a more sustainable and accessible urban environment. I am hopeful that the Area Committee 4, in collaboration with other local stakeholders, will consider this proposal for the betterment of our local community and the promotion of greener transportation alternatives.
