As the deadline for questions has been extended to 22nd March midday, please find two questions for the Audit committee on the 25th of March.

Question 1

I'd like to thank the Director of Legal and Democratic Services for the response that was sent on the 21st of March to Mr Oldreive's supplemental questions from the last meeting.

However, some parts of the questions were not answered.

From Mr Oldreive's first supplemental question:

Q1. Was the Monitoring Officer aware and what details did he know about the arrangements for transitional support, including loans and cash support?

Although it's great to have confirmation that Bristol Waste were to provide back office support, did the Monitoring Officer or any of his team have discussions with Bristol Waste about the loans and cash support?

Did the Monitoring Officer know if Cabinet members (including stakeholder Deputy Mayor Cheney) and the Council's director on Bristol Waste board (Councillor Steve Pearce) were aware of these loans and cash support?

Question 2

To follow up on Mr Oldreive's second supplemental question, were the loans and cash support made from Bristol Waste to Stepping Up made without a 'Reserved Matter' request?

Question 1. It is my understanding that a 'Lessons Learned' report in relation to the considerable overspend at Bristol Beacon was supposed to have been made available by now. Please can you give an update on when and how the lessons learned report will be made available to the public?

Question 2. The external auditors were clear about the importance of the lessons learned report in relation to the Bristol Beacon, and requested it before completion of the works. It looks as if the Mayor's Office did not want to the report completed until after Bristol Beacon reopened (at the end of November 2023) and possibly not until after the local elections in May 2024. Are there any powers available to the external auditors, or to the audit committee, to ensure that such a lessons learned report is actually completed and made publicly available?
