Purpose of the report

To hold a hearing to consider an application for review of the premises licence in respect of Lakota, 6 Upper York Street, Bristol, BS2 8QN submitted by Mr Mark Curtis, Pollution Control.

Context

1. An application for the review of the premises licence in respect of Lakota, 6 Upper York Street, Bristol, BS2 8QN was submitted by Mr Mark Curtis, Pollution Control on 5 December 2016.

The grounds of the application for review are that in the opinion of Bristol City Council's Environmental Health Officer (Pollution Control Team) the premises are being operated contrary to the licensing objectives of the prevention of public nuisance.

Advertising

4. The application has been advertised in accordance with regulation 38 of the Licensing Act 2003. The notice has been displayed at the premises and notices have been displayed at Council Offices of 100 Temple Street, Bristol and City Hall, College Green Bristol.

Recommendations:

5. Under section 53(C) of the Licensing Act 2003 the Authority must hold a hearing and consider the application and any relevant representations. Having regard to the application and representations the sub-committee must take such of the steps mentioned below, if any, as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. In making this (and all licensing decisions) the subcommittee must have regard to the guidance and policy included in the subcommittee's pack

The steps are—

- (a) the modification of the conditions of the premises licence,
- (b) the exclusion of a licensable activity from the scope of the licence,
- (c) the removal of the designated premises supervisor from the licence,
- (d) the suspension of the licence for a period not exceeding three months, or
- (e) the revocation of the licence.
