The Council has been awarded funding of £4.728m by the government to deliver a discretionary grant funding scheme. West of England regional authorities' have joined together to develop a framework policy under which grant funding can be delivered, supporting those businesses with fixed ongoing property costs and who were not entitled to claim grant funding from previous government schemes. This is the fourth tranche of funding allocated under the policy and further grant funding will be paid over the coming weeks.
