- 1. In the agenda item report an objective of "fair and inclusive" housing is mentioned. Do you believe it is fair that at least 13,000 households are waiting to be housed, these are only the ones who have come forward for support, by Bristol City Council?
- No. I do not believe it is fair that anyone in Bristol is in need of a home and that's why we've made delivering homes in balanced communities our number one priority.
- 2. Central government has proven that money can be generated and is available during a crisis to solve a problem if the will and or need exists.
