Head of City Transport	23/02/2022 – The Head of City Transport provided the following update: CRR27 reflects the overall programme risk around lack of resource etc. In order to address this, a prioritisation process will take place with the administration and the Programme Management Office to determine where best to allocate resources. This will then determine which projects might be stopped or paused. At present, no schemes have been identified as a risk. As the process progresses and completes, a further update can be provided if required. It is not certain when this process will be complete, but it's likely that this will be in around 2-3 months' time.
