Safer Communities Manager	<i>“In 2019/2020, there were 5 recorded crimes, in the following year (2020/2021) there were 26. These crimes included a combination of assaults, robberies, and public order offences. There were also 40 incidents of anti-social behaviour recorded over the same period. An increase in both crime and ASB over the summer months is expected but this rise in crime and ASB</i>

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			<p data-bbox="1240 220 1995 248"><i>were cause for concern for stakeholders in the area”.</i></p> <p data-bbox="1240 325 2130 539">The above statement was used to summarise the increase in recorded crime in the Harbourside area during 2020-2021 that contributed to the rationale behind implementing the Harbourside Project. The full needs analysis and project closure reports were not created as public facing documents and therefore are not available for publication.</p> <p data-bbox="1240 616 2141 1380">However, the following summary may provide further context and insight. In summary, the closure report concludes that 16 offences were recorded at the Lloyds Amphitheatre between July and September 2020. This decreased by 75% to only four recorded offences during the same period in 2021. Recorded police ASB incidents also decreased by 30% from 26 (between July and September 2020) to two (between July and September 2021). As with all locational interventions it is difficult to attribute the decrease in ASB and crime numbers (in most categories) solely to the partnership work completed in the area. The work will undoubtedly have had a significant impact but other elements could have influenced this effect, such as the autumnal weather, the easing of lockdown prohibitions and general fluctuations in footfall numbers. Some of the project initiatives such as the increased and improved signage, and the installation of the new CCTV cameras, have left a legacy which has improved the area for the better. As this is very much a seasonal destination, the problems may reoccur. However, with additional cameras installed, the tried and tested pop-up youth events, and the relationships built throughout this piece of work, it is anticipated that the</p>

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			Partnership can respond more quickly to any future spikes in ASB and criminal activities in this area and other parts of the City going forward.
