- 4. At the panel meeting also is was put forward that the applicant from Sturminster & Stockwood Community Association be supported by s106 if possible.
- 5. The Community Buildings Team were subsequently approached and they

felt that if the applicant was to be supported from the s106 budget they would also recommend that accessibility improvements are made to the entrance and exit ways to the building. However I have been unable o discuss this with the Community Buildings Team Manager at the time of the papers being published.

- 6. It is suggested that the Neighbourhood Committee approves the recommendation from s106 06/03970 / Tibbott Walk, Stockwood / ZCD...562 £2,863.78, for the dual purpose toilet and the improvements to entrance/exit ways to Sturminster and Stockwood Community Association, subject to a discussion with the Community Building Team Manager.
- 7. If there are difficulties in allocating the s106 funds, the recommendation from the Wellbeing panel is to support from the Wellbeing Fund.
- 8. In 2014/15 the NP approved £1,500 from Wellbeing as a contribution to accessible toilets at Christ Church on Petherton Road, subject to the funded chairs being installed.
- 9. I am happy to advise that the chairs have now been installed and request that the Neighbourhood Committee release the £1,500 for the contribution to the accessible toilets.
- 10. The next Wellbeing deadline for application is 11th November 2016, with the panel meeting for recommendations on 22nd November 2016 for discussion and agreement by the Neighbourhood Committee on 14th December 2016

Legal Information

When councillors decide how the wellbeing fund is spent they should have due regard to the public sector equality duty that applies to all public bodies. This duty is contained in the Equality Act 2010 and came in to force on 6 April 2011. It replaces previous equality duties under the Sex Discrimination, Race Relations and Disability Discrimination Acts.

The duty means that councillors are required to have due regard to the need to:

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation and other conduct prohibited under the Act
- Promote equality of opportunity between different groups
- Foster good relations between people from different groups

The duty covers the following protected characteristics:

• Disability, Sexual orientation, Age, Gender reassignment, Religion and belief; Sex, Race, Pregnancy and maternity.

It also applies to marriage and civil partnership, but only in respect of the requirement to eliminate discrimination and harassment.
